2nd Bangladesh Film Festival inaugurated in Agartala

Geographical boundaries can never be an obstacle in the way of building cordial relation. There is a huge potential being created for economic and commercial prosperity with the opening up of new horizons of communication including water and railways between Tripura and Bangladesh, enunciated Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb in the inaugural programme of 2ndBangladesh Film Festival at Hotel Polo Tower in Agartala yesterday. The representatives of Tripura and Bangladesh have exchanged souvenirs. The Film Festival'sinaugural programmewas organized following Covid-19 guidelines. The films will be showcased following Covid-19 guidelinesin April and May this year.

The Chief Minister said, Tripura has an old friendly relationship with neighboring country Bangladesh which is also being reflected in cultural and commercial sectors. He invited the film directors to make use of the huge potential for filmmaking in Tripura. He said, Tripura is becoming a commercial hubof the Northeast. With the decrease in distance, there will be decrease in transport costs as well because of exporting goods using different opportunities including MaitriSetu, international railway via Akhaura, Special Economic Zone. Chittagong port and Haldia port, the distance will decrease in both cases. In this regard, Tripura will become a commercial corridor being the neighboring country of Bangladesh. As a result of it, Bangladesh will also reap benefits.

The Chief Minister also said, the blueprint for next 25 years 'Lakshya 2047' has recently been released which shows the direction in which the state government will be taking the state forward. As a result of this, the new generation will be able to have their education and will be able to establish themselves in life. Besides that, investors will also find proper opportunity to invest in potential industrial sectors of Tripura. He invited the investors of Bangladesh to come forward in commercial development including setting up of industrial factories making use of the potent industrial environment that has been created in Tripura. He said, with the sincere efforts of the Prime Minister, the old friendly relation is facilitating development of both the countries. The present Bangladesh government has set up examples of achieving success in various fields.
