**Government is trying to solve people's
problems step by step: Chief Minister**

The state government is sincerely working to resolve the issues of its citizens, said Chief Minister Prof. (Dr.) Manik Saha during the 48th edition of the 'Mukhyamantri Samipeshu' programme held yesterday at his official residence. Through this initiative, the Chief Minister listens directly to the grievances of the people and takes steps toward resolving them. Speaking to the media, Chief Minister stated that the state government, under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, is working for the overall development of Tripura.
