

Mukhyamantri 'Samipeshu' programme held
Chief Minister's initiative to solve various problems of aid seekers

The state has all the facilities of government medical services. Super specialty services are also in operation. Kidney transplants have been successfully completed for three persons. Chief Minister Prof. (Dr.) Manik Saha has urged the aspirants to avail the medical services available in the State through the Mukhyamantri 'Samipeshu' programme.

In the 49th episode of the Mukhyamantri Samipeshu program, Chief Minister directly spoke to the people suffering from problems at the Chief Minister's official residence yesterday. The Chief Minister listened to the various problems of the people seeking help from different parts of the State, including treatment and employment, and took necessary initiatives to resolve the problems. Motilal Debbarma of Ujan Abhaynagar in Agartala requested help for the treatment of his sick son. Chief Minister immediately directed the Health Department and the Director of the Social Welfare and Social Education Department to take necessary steps for financial assistance in addition to providing assistance for the treatment of Motilal Debbarma's son. While Jayanti Pal (Das) of Rangamura in Belonia sought help for the treatment of her husband who has been suffering from heart disease, Chief Minister immediately spoke to the Medical Superintendent of GBP Hospital and ensured free medicines for her husband's treatment. Sukul Mia's wife of Sabroom is currently suffering from kidney problems. The doctors have advised his wife to undergo a kidney transplant. The Chief Minister, after seeing all the medical documents of Sukul Mia's wife, advised her to get her kidney treatment done in the State. When Mousumi Bhattacharjee of Agartala, Jharna Das of Kumaritila sought help for her son's eye treatment, Bhabatosh Sarkar of Chailengta and Shankar Deb of Milansangha of Agartala sought help for his brother's treatment, the Chief Minister took the initiative to provide them with the necessary assistance for their treatment and also advised them to take advantage of the Chief Minister's Jan Arogya Yojana. Also, on that day, Sanjib Tripura of Karbuk and Thayang Mag of Gandachara applied for a job in Dye-in-Harness. The Chief Minister directed the Chief Minister's Secretary Dr. PK Chakravarty to take necessary steps in this regard.
