Meeting of the Standing Committee on Education and Health of West Tripura Zilla Parishad Held

A meeting of the Standing Committee on Education and Health of the West Tripura Zilla Parishad was recently held yesterday at the Zilla Parishad's conference hall. The meeting was chaired by the standing committee chairman, Bishnudhan Das. Acting Sabhadhipati of West Tripura Zilla Parishad, Bishwajit Shil, along with other members of the standing committee and officials from different departments, were present at the meeting.

During the meeting, an official from the Education Department informed that a tube well has been installed in Malabati Para SB School, located in Nepaltilla under Debendranagar Panchayat of Jirania RD block, with assistance from the Drinking Water and Sanitation Department. The relevant department official was instructed to take steps to upgrade Dugangi SB School, located in Bamutiya block, to a high school. A Health Department official stated that the Primary health centers at Bharatsardar Para in Anandnagar under Dukli RD block and Purba Champamura under Jirania RD block will be made operational very soon. Bharat Chowdhury Para Primary-health center under Hezamara block is already functioning and providing medical services. An official from the Social Welfare and Social Education Department informed that approval has been given to open 30 new Anganwadi Centres in the West District with assistance from MGNREGA, and for the construction of toilets in 191 existing Anganwadi Centres. The official also mentioned that 1,475 new social pensions will be provided under the Chief Minister's Social Assistance Scheme in the current financial year. Additionally, 72 child care centres operated by NGOs in the West District are being integrated and run in coordination with nearby Anganwadi centres.

Acting Sabhadhipati of the West Tripura Zilla Parishad, Bishwajit Shilsaid that every school must hold meetings of the Balika Manch and that awareness programs involving students, teachers, guardians, and public representatives must be organized to combat child marriage. He also Stressed on holding review meetings for schools in West District that performed poorly in the secondary and higher secondary examinations.
