

CM at Sushason Divas programme
Government is prioritizing good governance for people's welfare

He said, the birthday of former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee is being celebrated as Sushason Divas. Atal Bihari Vajpayee was a renowned politician, a poet and a litterateur. At the same time he was a freedom fighter who dreamt of building a corruption-free India and himself made various initiatives to establish good governance in the country. And through this Sushason Divas we are paying tribute to him for his magnanimous contribution in the development of India.

The programme at Pragna Bhavan was organized by the Tripura Institution for Transformation (TIFT).
