Appointment Letters Handed Over to 45 Specialist Doctors Tripura is gradually becoming self-reliant in various fields: Chief Minister

Earlier, due to the shortage of specialist doctors, it was not possible to provide them in every district or subdivisional hospital. With the appointment of 45 new specialist doctors, this shortfall will be partially addressed. Since 2018, the number of doctors in different health centers has been increased. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision is to build a self-reliant India by enhancing the skills of educated youth. With improvements in the state's healthcare services, the number of patients being referred outside the state has reduced significantly. Speaking at the event, Health Secretary Kiran Gitte said that 215 doctors will be recruited to fill the shortage of doctors in the state.
