Mukhyamantri Samipeshu
CM Listens to People's Grievances in 41st Episode
of 'Samipeshu'; Assures Medical and Social Assistance

In the 41st episode of the Chief Minister's flagship outreach initiative 'Mukhyamantri Samipeshu' held yesterday, Chief Minister Professor (Dr) Manik Saha patiently listened to the grievances and appeals of distressed citizens, primarily seeking medical support and social allowances. Most of the visitors at the programme came forward with pleas for medical assistance for their children or family members. Showing a compassionate and proactive stance, the Chief Minister directed immediate actions to address their concerns.

Gopal Debnath of Teliamura sought help for his 3-and-a-half-year-old son suffering from a congenital brain condition. Upon examining the submitted documents, the Chief Minister instructed the Medical Superintendent of GBP Hospital to extend immediate support. Similar assistance was sought for son of Kajal Debnath of Lankamura who was undergoing treatment for a brain tumor at GBP Hospital. The Chief Minister assured Kajal of necessary assistance after reviewing the medical records. Appeals for similar medical aid were made by Shibadevi Jamatia of Amarpur, Ajit Saha of East Shivanagar (Agartala), Sameer Ghosh of Lankamura, Pradeep Deb of Madhya Bhubanban, Rahul Sharma of East Kalabaria (Belonia), Lohkikanta Patari of Rishyamukh (Belonia), Tirtha Pal of B.K. Road, Archana Das (Singh) of North Champamura, Sanab Saha and Apu Shil of Bardowali, Suryadhan Sinha of Kamalpur and Kartik Chandra Saha of Amarpur. All sought support for the treatment of their children or family members.

In response, the Chief Minister instructed Dr. Shankar Chakraborty, Medical Superintendent of GBP Hospital, and Dr. S. Debbarma, Superintendent of the Cancer Hospital, to ensure necessary medical support. He further urged citizens to have confidence in the state's healthcare infrastructure and services. In addition to medical concerns, several citizens appealed for social assistance. The Chief Minister instructed the Additional Director of the Social Welfare and Social Education Department to expedite the process of granting social allowances to the differently-abled son of Shantanu Kumar Kar (Palace Compound), Saraswati Saha (Bhattapukur) and Anjana Saha (Roy) of Matripalli, Badharghat.

The session was attended by key officials including Health Secretary Kiran Gitte, Additional Director of Social Welfare L. Rankhal, Deputy Secretary of the CM's Secretariat Pranoy Debnath, and the medical superintendents of GBP Hospital, Atal Bihari Vajpayee Regional Cancer Hospital and IGM Hospital, alongside representatives from Ayushman Bharat, Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana and the CM Jan Arogya Yojana.
