**Chief Minister inaugurates a 50-bed girls' hostel for
Kakraban Government Degree College and DIET College**
Tripura has reached a new height in the field of education: CM

Tripura has reached a new height in the field of education today. In line with the Prime Minister's visionary National Education Policy 2020, special emphasis is being given to vocational education in the state. As a result, students are becoming not only degree holders but also skilled and self-reliant.

Speaking at the inauguration of a 50-bed girls' hostel for the Government Degree College and DIET College in Kakraban yesterday, Chief Minister Professor (Dr.) Manik Saha termed this a significant step forward. He stated that education is the backbone of the nation; without education, true development of any society is not possible. An educated society is a self-reliant society. Education is the bridge of knowledge that leads us from ignorance to the path of enlightenment.

The Chief Minister said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has repeatedly emphasized that education should not be limited to textbooks alone — it should be qualitative and value-based to build a truly educated society. Addressing the students, he said, "Only studying books is not enough; one must work for the society. The spirit of service must be nurtured from childhood." He added, "Our goal is to build complete human beings — not just students who pass exams, but citizens who are responsible and service-minded." The Chief Minister further said that, as the Prime Minister stresses the integration of values, development, and nation-building, Tripura too must follow that path.

The Chief Minister noted that this year UNESCO recognized Tripura as a fully literate state — a matter of pride for all people of the state. With a literacy rate exceeding 95 percent, Tripura now leads the education sector in Northeast India. He also mentioned that the present government has taken initiatives to establish three new colleges in Kakraban, Ambassa, and Karbook, which will benefit students from these and nearby areas.

He said that the state has introduced the Chief Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme to encourage students with special needs to pursue higher education. Alongside this, a Drone Center, a Dental College, and a new Medical College have been established at the university level. There are also plans to set up a University of Health Sciences in the future.

The Chief Minister said, "Our sole objective is to ensure that every person in Tripura becomes an educated, skilled, and conscious citizen. We envision a prosperous, addiction-free Tripura — a state illuminated by education, culture, and morality."

He further added that Tripura is progressing steadily on the path of development. Among the northeastern states of India, Tripura ranks second in per capita income — a matter of great pride. From the panchayat level to the state level, Tripura has received several national awards, which reflect the effectiveness of the current government's governance system.

The Chief Minister expressed hope that the new educational institution and hostel in Kakraban would further expand the area's educational scope and open up new horizons in shaping the future of the younger generation.

Finance Minister Pranajit Singha Roy, speaking at the event, said that the present state government has been working to expand opportunities for higher education in Tripura. As a result, students from Tripura no longer have to go outside the state for higher studies as they did before.

Higher Education Minister Kishore Barman stated that the state government has taken the initiative to establish a Government Women's College at Nalchhar from the next academic year. In addition, a Women's University will be set up in Agartala. He further mentioned that necessary steps have been taken to address the shortage of teachers in the state's colleges.

The welcome address at the event was delivered by the Secretary of the Higher Education Department, Ravel Hemendra Kumar. Among others present at the program were Sabhadhipati of Gomati Zilla Parishad Debal Debroy, MLAs Rampada Jamatia and Jitendra Majumdar, District Magistrate of Gomati District Rinku Lather, and social activist Sabita Nag. It is worth mentioning that the construction of the hostel at Kakraban DIET College cost ₹1 crore 76 lakh.
