

**Jirania block-level Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra**

**Government aims to bring government scheme opportunities  
to the last person of the society: Tourism Minister**

Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra has been launched to extend the opportunities of various public welfare schemes of the State Government and the Central Government to the people. Along with this, the Prati Ghare Sushason 2.0 campaign has also started under the initiative of the state government. Both these programs aim to provide access to government schemes and services to the last person of the society. Minister of Food, Transport and Tourism Department Sushanta Chowdhury said this while inaugurating Jirania block-level Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra, Prati Ghare Sushason 2.0, Jirania block-level youth festival, Kaushal fair and Ayush village program at Makumaikami High School premises of Harijoy Chowdhury Gram Panchayat yesterday. He said that from three-tier Panchayat to urban areas, the eligible beneficiaries should not be deprived of the benefits of government schemes. Different members of the cabinet have been assigned the responsibility of different districts to ensure proper implementation of Prati Ghare Sushason 2.0 and Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra.

BDO of Jirania Block Sumit Kumar Das delivered the welcome address on the occasion. Chairman of Jirania Panchayat Samiti Manju Das, Vice Chairman Pritam Debnath, Chairman of Jirania Block Advisory Committee Subhamani Debbarma, prominent philanthropist Gauranga Bhowmik and others were present on the occasion. At the program, Mitali Debnath, who recently won gold in 1500m and silver in 800m at the 22nd Asian Masters Athletics, was felicitated with a cheque of 10,000 rupees and a memento.
