International Human Rights Day

Common people have to be made aware on human rights: Governor

Our constitution has given various rights to the citizens. Different legal bodies are working under the jurisdiction of the law to protect the rights. Human rights are still being violated. People from all sections especially police administration should take a more active role in controlling incidents like human rights violations. Governor of Tripura Indrasena Reddy Nallu said this while inaugurating International Human Rights Day program at Rabindra Bhavan on December 10, 2023.
