

Inauguration of the newly constructed building of Kalyanpur Community Health Centre

Government is serious about improving the quality of health services in the state: CM

The profession of doctor is a noble profession. People should have a sense of respect for doctors. Sometimes unexpected things happen between doctors and patients families in hospitals which is by no means desirable. The relationship between doctors and patients should be sweeter because doctors give certificates both in case of birth and death. This was said by Chief Minister Professor (Dr.) Manik Saha while inaugurating the newly constructed building and staff quarters at Kalyanpur Community Health Center on 3rd August, 2022. On the occasion of the inaugural function of the new building and staff quarters of the Community Health Center, a small programme was organized in Sonartari Mukta manch at Kalyanpur Bazar.

In his inaugural address, Chief Minister said that the government is sincere in improving the quality of health services in the state and inaugurating the hospital is not enough, the surroundings of the hospital should be kept clean through collective efforts of all. He said the hospital is like a temple because people have to go to the hospital to be cured if they have a physical illness. So the hospital should be kept as holy as the temple. Besides, patients and their families should trust the doctors and have faith in their services. In this case it is very important to maintain good relationship between doctor and patients. Similarly, doctors have to discharge their professional responsibilities to serve patients. The Chief Minister said that the central government and the state government are very sincere in improving the health system because health is a very important issue. If health is good, everything is good for people. The Chief Minister expressed hope that with the combined efforts of all, we will be able to build a better Tripura.

Chief Minister also said that the government has continued the anti-drug campaign in the state. Parents should also come forward in the anti-drug campaign. He urged parents to come forward to prevent children from drug addiction. The Chief Minister also said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken a unique role in the overall development of the country. Meanwhile, the state government is also making continuous efforts to improve the quality of service of the hospitals. The Chief Minister said that the state currently has two medical colleges, 6 state hospitals (4 allopathy, 1 homeo and 1 ayurvedic). He said that the state government has taken special initiative to establish a dental college in the state.

Director of Health and Family Welfare Department, Dr. Radha Debbarma said that 6 crore 70 lakh rupees were spent on the construction of the newly constructed building of Kalyanpur Community Health Centre. This Community Health Centre has 30 beds. Moreover, 2 crore 95 lakh rupees have been spent on the construction of staff quarters.

The programme was also attended by Legislative Assembly Chief Whip MLA Kalyani Roy, MLA Pinaki Das Chowdhury, Principal Secretary of Health Department, Dr. Debashish Basu, DM of Khowai District L.T Darlong, Sabhadipati of Khowai Zilla Parishad Joydeb Debbarma, Kalyanpur Community Health Centre Patient Welfare Association Chairman Soumen Gope, social worker Jiban Debnath and others. Goyang Phang High School, Ghilatali Bazar High School, Rathia H.S School were felicitated at the programme for completing 100 percent covid vaccination. Chief Minister handed over the award to the officials of the school. Besides, this Chief Minister also honored Jagadish Bhattacharya, son of late Yogesh Bhattacharya, the person who gave land for Kalyanpur Community Health Centre. Certificates were given to 2 persons who got access to health services through Ayushman card. On behalf of the workers of Kalyanpur Community Health Centre, a cheque of 5000 rupees was handed over to Chief Minister for CM Relief fund.
