Child Trafficking Prevention Workshop Held in Belonia

A significant workshop on the prevention of child trafficking took place yesterday at the Conference Hall of Belonia Circuit House. The event was organized by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights in collaboration with the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights and the South Tripura District Administration. The workshop saw the presence of several key figures, including Consultant Sunakshi Radhika from the National Child Rights Protection Commission, District Magistrate and Collector Dr. Siddharth Shiv Jaiswal, Additional Superintendent of Police Maria Krishna Chandra Shekhar and Additional District Magistrate (PP) Hemant Debbarma. Other attendees included Sub-Divisional Magistrates, Sub-Divisional Police Officers, Block Officers, Commandants of the Border Security Force, members of the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, District Child Welfare Committee members, and officers from the Social Welfare and Social Education Departments. Representatives from the Information and Culture Department, Childline, and various NGOs also participated. During the workshop, Sunakshi Radhika reviewed the various measures implemented to protect child rights in South Tripura. She presented a detailed overview through a PowerPoint presentation, highlighting the steps taken by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights. Radhika emphasized the importance of the proper implementation of these measures and urged all stakeholders to be diligent in their efforts. She also expressed satisfaction with the initiatives taken by the District Magistrate to prevent child marriage. Deputy Commissioner, Additional Superintendent of Police and State Child Rights Protection Commission member Sharmila Chowdhury were among the speakers who addressed the workshop. They called upon every responsible citizen to actively participate in the fight against child trafficking and child marriage. This workshop in Belonia is part of a broader initiative by the National Child Rights Protection Commission to conduct similar events in 100 districts across the country's borders and adjacent areas. The aim is to bolster efforts to prevent child trafficking and ensure the protection of child rights nationwide.
