



Taking note of that, the state government has emphasized upon promotion of different languages. Other language speaking persons are also doing research on Kokborok language. Two memorial awards are being awarded for contribution in Kokborok language and literature. Seeking education, job and income in Kokborok has become possible. Kokborok subject is being taught in 45 schools in the state from Class 1 to Class 8 on primary level. Secondary and Higher Secondary level Kokborok subject teaching schools have been increased. Kokborok has been given importance even in case of government recruitments.

Tribal Welfare Minister Mevar Kumar Jamatia in the programme said, Kokborok language is being spoken in Tripura as well as outside the country. About 15 to 20 lakh people speak in Kokborok. The state government has taken up various initiatives for the development and promotion of Kokborok language. Recruitment of Kokborok Assistant Professors in 22 Degree Colleges is one ultimate example. Other dignitaries present in the programme were Chairman of Kokborok Advisory Committee and MLA Atul Debbarma, Director of Tribal Research & Cultural Institute Ananda Hari Jamatia, and Director of Kokborok & Other Minority Languages department Dasarath Debbarma.
