**Education Minister inaugurated temporary school
of Mohanpur Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya**
**Different kinds of steps are being taken to provide

The state government has given utmost importance upon expansion and improved infrastructure of education sector. Different kinds of steps are being taken to provide quality education to the students, enunciated Education Minister Ratan Lal Nath after inaugurating temporary school of Mohanpur Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya of West Tripura district yesterday. He said, Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya will be built permanently on 50 Kani land of Khowai Chowmuhni area of Hezamara spending 60 crore rupees. The construction work will start from next month. The school is starting with 114 students from class 6 to 8. He said, NCERT syllabus has started in all schools under the state government. For this purpose, 31 thousand 263 teachers have already been trained recently. Vocational courses have been started in 135 schools. More 70 schools will be brought under this. Super-30 scheme has been started for merit students. Notun Disha and Bochor Bacha schemes also have been started. Mission 100 Vidyajyoti scheme has been started in 100 schools. 135 Bengali Medium Schools were turned to English Medium Schools. Mukhyamantri Medha Onko Puraskar has been started. All girl students of class 9 from APL and BPL category families are being given bicycles. He said, all kinds of initiatives have been taken for bright future of the students. The state government's efforts will only be worthwhile if the students could make good use of the opportunities.

The temporary school was built at the cost of 59 lakh 98 thousand rupees.
