

The Chief Minister also stressed upon digitalising, introducing Single Window Service and modernising the management system at check-post. He also ordered the authorities to keep close eye on every vehicle so that no vehicle could illegally enter the state. On the Chief Minister's orders during his visit at the check-post, the vehicles standing at the check-post were checked on certain parameters and two out of four trucks were liable to be fined. The Chief Minister also invigilated on how the doubtful trucks are being checked.

On the way to the check-post, some stone crusher machines standing on NH road came into Chief Minister's notice. The Chief Minister then asked the North DM Nagesh Kumar BK whether the stone crushers have been approved legally or not. Apart from that, the Chief Minister also ordered to be vigilant on vehicles trying to enter the state through alternate roads. He expressed that the government aims to promote trade in the state but it in legal ways.
