

State has adequate stock of essential commodities

A few local dailies have reported that some parts of the national highway NH-8 at Atharamura has become unfit for traffic due to heavy rains, and there may be a shortage of petroleum products and other daily necessities in the state. The related news has come to the attention of the state government. In this regard, Director of Food, Public Supply and Consumer Affairs of the state government has informed the people of the state in a press release that the communication system of the state by rail is completely normal at present. On 3rd August, 2022, Dharmanagar depot and various agencies in the state had a total of 2061 kilolitres of petrol and 2330 kilolitres of diesel in stock. Moreover, on 2nd August, 2022, 303 kilolitres of petrol and 321 kilolitres of diesel were dispatched from Dharmanagar depot which are currently en route. Overall the state has a total of 2364 kilolitres of petrol and 2651 kilolitres of diesel to meet the demand for the next 9-10 days. On the other hand, there are adequate stocks of other daily

commodities including potatoes and onions.

According to the latest news, traffic on the national highway has been fully restored from afternoon of 3rd August, 2022. Therefore, the state government has requested the people, not to panic in the emerging situation and refrain from buying extra items out of apprehension

Newly constructed building of Kalyanpur CHC inaugurated

The profession of doctor is a noble profession. People should have a sense of respect for doctors. Sometimes unexpected things happen between doctors and patients families in hospitals which is by no means desirable. The relationship between doctors and patients should be sweeter because doctors give certificates both in case of birth and death. This was said by chief minister Professor (Dr.) Manik Saha while inaugurating the newly constructed building and staff quarters at Kalyanpur Community Health Center on 3rd August, 2022. On the occasion of the inaugural function of the new building and staff

quarters of the Community Health Center, a small programme was organized in Sonartari Mukta manch at Kalyanpur Bazar.

In his inaugural address, chief minister said that the government is sincere about improving the quality of health services in the state and inaugurating the hospital is not enough, surroundings of the hospital should be kept clean through collective efforts of all. He said the hospital is like a temple because people have to go to the hospital to be cured if they have a physical illness. So the hospital should be kept as holy as the temple. Besides, patients and their families should trust the doctors and have faith in their services. In this case it is very important to maintain good relationship between doctor and patients. Similarly, doctors have to discharge their professional responsibilities to serve patients. The chief minister said that the central government and the state government are very sincere in improving the health system because health is a very important issue. If health is good, everything is good for people. The chief minister expressed hope that with the combined efforts of all, we will be able to build a better Tripura.

Chief minister also said that the government has continued the anti-drug campaign in the state. Parents should also come forward in the anti-drug campaign. He urged parents to come forward to prevent children from drug addiction. The state government is also making continuous efforts to improve the quality of service of the hospitals. He said that the state currently has two medical colleges, 6 state hospitals (4 allopathy, 1 homeo and 1 ayurvedic). He said that the state government has taken special initiative to establish a dental college in the state.

Director of health and family welfare department, Dr. Radha Debbarma said that an amount of 6 crore 70 lakh rupees has been spent in the construction of the new building of Kalyanpur Community Health Centre. This Community Health Centre has 30 beds. Moreover, 2 crore 95 lakh rupees have been spent on the construction of staff quarters.

Super-30 selection test -2022 held

This year's Super-30 selection test-2022 was organized by School Education department in association with State Council for Education and Research Training (SCERT) on 31st July, 2022 in 25 centres across the state. A total of 1345 aspirant students from different places of the state appeared in the selection test. As

per merit list, 30 students will get sponsorship under the scheme.

It is also mentioned that Super-30 scheme was launched by the Education department, Government of Tripura in the academic year 2021-22. The selected Madhyamik passed students who are interested in Medical or Engineering studies, can get coaching facility in the national level institutes of their choice for preparation of JEE/NEET during the next two years under the scheme. A total of 30 meritorious students of different government schools, government aided schools and Madrassa will be selected as per merit list. The students with family income of less than Rs 8 lakh yearly will get the benefit of this scheme as per 100-point reservation rules. One reserved seat for Divyangan candidate has been introduced for the first time. Rs 2.40 lakh per year under the scheme will be provided to the selected students.
