CM Covid Special Relief Package launched in Belonia today

The Chief Minister Covid Special Relief Package has been ceremonially inaugurated at Agnibina community hall of Belonia today. MLA Arun Chandra Bhowmik inaugurated this sub-division level programme. Speaking on this occasion he urged all to comply with COVID guidelines. The programme was also attended by DM in charge of South district Suresh Chandra Das, senior deputy magistrate Sudhangshu Sarkar and other dignitaries.

In this inaugural programme food packets were handed over to 30 Antyoday and Priority Group families. Each packet contained 2 kg masoor dal, 1 litre mustard oil, 3 kg potato, 1 kg salt, 2 kg. onion, 500 gm soyabean, 250 gm turmeric powder and 100 gm cumin powder. The said beneficiaries have also received 5 kg free rice each from the ration shops under the said scheme. A total of 29,440 beneficiaries will be covered in Belonia sub-division under this scheme.

Massive initiative by Amarpur fishery supervisor's office

Various development programmes have been taken up by the office of fishery supervisor, Amarpur during the 2021-22 financial year. For the socio-economic development of poor in Amarpur subdivision fish fingerlings will distributed among 1,327 families and oneday training will also be imparted under the Chief Minister Swanirbhar Yojana. Each beneficiary family will receive 500 fingerlings. For this purpose Rs. 10,88,140 will be spent. In addition, under the department's own scheme, assistance will be given for fish farming in different water bodies, and to co-operative or self-help

groups. In this initiative also 565 people will benefit, as fingerling, lime and fish feed will also be provided. To implement this Rs. 25.99 lakh will be spent. Fishery supervisor Ajoy Das has divulged this information recently.
