

3,635 Farmers registered under PM Kisan Samman Nidhi

Under Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi 3,635 farmers of Dhalai district have been registered. Under the scheme each farmer is entitled to financial assistance of Rs. 6000 to be transferred in three equal installments. Detailing further on the issue agriculture officer in Dhalai office Soumen Nandi informed, from the beginning to till date 3,594 farmers of Raishyabari block have received first installment totaling Rs. 71.88 lakh, 3,594 farmers have received second installment totaling Rs. 72.04 lakh and 3,568 farmers have received third installment totaling Rs. 71.36 lakh.

Fingerlings distributed in Kalyanpur block under MSPY

Fingerlings were distributed among the beneficiary families of Mukhyamantri Swanirbhar Parivar Yojana in South Durgapur panchayat under Kalyanpur block on July 5. Organized by the fisheries department the distribution programme was inaugurated by MLA Pinaki Das Chowdhury. Rui, Katla, Mrigel etc. fingerlings were given to 137 beneficiaries. By July 16 960 beneficiaries of the block are to be covered under the scheme. Each beneficiary is getting 500

fingerlings. Alongside training on fish farming is being imparted to the beneficiaries.

Fish farmers of Santirbar subdivision to come under MSPY

During the current financial year fish farmers of Santirbazar subdivision will be brought under Mukhyamantri Swanirbhar Yojana to make them financially self-reliant. A total of 2,720 fish farming families of the subdivision will receive benefits of this scheme. Each beneficiary will get 500 fingerlings of Rui, Katla, Mrigel fish. Distribution of fingerlings has started from July 3. From Bagafa block 1,360 families will come under the scheme for which Rs. 9,43,840 will be spent. Santirbazar subdivisional fishery office has informed this.

Vaccination programmes under Machmara primary health centre

On July 3 vaccination programmes were held at Dhepachera under North Machmara health sub-centre, at Kandra Karbaripara Anganwadi centre under Kamdebchera health sub-centre and at South Dhanichera health sub-centre attached to Machmara primary health centre. In these programmes total 21 children and mothers were vaccinated. As part of the programme the health workers also discussed on importance of vaccination, need for

consumption of iron tablet, issues related to iodine deficiency and way-out for that, precautions for pregnant mothers etc. Besides, the people present there were advised to abide by COVID guidelines. The family welfare and preventive medicine department has informed this in a press release.

320 Families to come under MSPY in Kailashahar subdivision

Under the Mukhyamantri Swanirbhar Parivar Yojana animal resources development department will be giving assistance to 320 families of Kailashahar subdivision for duck rearing. Among the beneficiaries 160 will be selected from Gournagar block and 160 from Chandipur block. Under the scheme each beneficiary will get 10 ducklings free of cost. For this, Rs. 1,300 will spent on each beneficiary. Unakoti district office of ARDD has informed this.

12,320 Mandays generated in Briddhanagar GP

During the last financial year with the objective of creating permanent assets and infrastructure in rural areas 12,320 mandays were generated under MGNREGA in Briddhanagar gram panchayat under Old Agartala block. Spending Rs. 22,94,562 construction of dam for flood control, land development, drain construction, excavation of water body for fish farming

etc. activities were executed under the scheme.

In addition, with the fund sanctioned under the 14th Finance Commission, construction of drain, renovation of rural roads, renovation of drain etc. works were accomplished. An amount of Rs. 1,72,257 was spent in implementation of these works. So far in this village 107 farmers have benefitted under Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi and 181 households have been covered under Atal Jaldhara Mission. The concerned gram panchayat has provided this information.

Health camp at Laxmanchera Anganwadi Centre

A health camp was organized at Laxmanchera Anganwadi centre under Nabinchera health sub-centre attached to Pecharthal primary health centre in Unakoti district on July 3. In this health camp 18 people of the area availed health care service. Among them 11 people had fever, four had stomach problem and rest had other problems. The patients having fever were asked to go for COVID Antigen test. Each of them was given medicines. Issues like health care of aged people, importance of institutional delivery, consumption of iron tablet to fight blood deficiency, problems born out of iodine deficiency, COVID vaccination, malaria and diarrhea etc. were discussed.
