

Jan Arogya Yojana: 16,930 persons treated in West district

Total 16,930 persons have been treated in West district under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana till now. The health department has spent Rs 14 crore 21 lakh 51 thousand 285 under the scheme for assisting the patients. The health department has informed this.

Administrative camp held in Sutarmura ADC village

One day village tour, administrative and health camp were organized by Sepahijala district administration at Sutarmura ADC village of Charilam block on December 4 with the objective of improving standard of life, social and economic conditions of rural people. Additional D.M and Collector (project) Tamal Majumder, SDM of Bisdhalgarh subdivision Jayanta Bhattacharjee, chairman of Sutarmura village committee Patikanna Debbarma, BDO of Charilam block Joydev Chakraborty and officers of different departments were present in the administrative team headed by D.M of Sepahijala district Vishwasree B.

The D.M visited 30 bedded girls hostel of Sutarmura High School. She inspected progress of betel nut plantation, pineapple

and Mausambi orchards in 0.4 hectare land near the school. She also visited to see the progress of the concrete buildings of Manmohan Debbarma and Sukumar Debbarma in Ward no- 3 under the village committee. The D.M instructed the representative of the concerned department to provide drinking water supply and power connection into Tuisa JB School.

After completion of the tour, D.M alongwith district, subdivision and block level officers discussed with the public representatives of village committee Sutarmura High School on progress of the development projects. In the meeting, the representative of Power department informed that Power connection was being provided to every house of Sutarmura village under Din Dayal Upadhaya scheme. Applications have been received or issuing 15 S.T, 18 PRTC, 8 Marriage certificates, and 13 income certificates in the camp. Health department provided required medicine after medical check-up of 68 persons. Antigen test of two persons has been done. Animal resources development department provided required medicine after treatment of 91 cattle.

60 water reservoirs targeted in West district

A target has been set by West district horticulture and soil conservation office for digging 60 water reservoirs in different blocks of West district for preservation of rainwater. Rs 90,000 will be spent for digging of each of the water reservoirs under MIDH scheme. Rs 54 lakh in total will be spent. Digging work of 5 water reservoirs has already been completed. 6 water reservoirs in Mohanpur block, 4 water reservoirs in Lefunga block, 5 water reservoirs in Bamutia block, 3 water reservoirs in Jirania block, 2 water reservoirs in Old Agartala block, 15 water reservoirs in Dukli block and 14 water reservoirs in Hejamara block will be dug. On the other hand, one water reservoir out of two in Belbari block and four water reservoirs out of nine have been dug. The West district horticulture and soil Conservation office has informed this.

Assistance for piggery in Khowai

Four beneficiaries of different panchayats in Khowai block will be covered by Khowai Subdivision animal resources development office for piggery to make them self-dependant. One beneficiary of West Chhebri Panchayat, one beneficiary of West Ganki panchayat, one beneficiary of Dhalabil Panchayat and one beneficiary

of Bagan panchayat in Khowai subdivision will be benefited under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana. 6 piglets, 1500 k.g feed, utensil and essential medicines will be provided to each of the beneficiaries. Distribution of piglet among the beneficiaries is going on. Rs 97,000 per unit will be spent for implementation of the scheme. The officer of Subdivision Animal Resources Development office Dr. Jhutan Ghosh Das informed this.

National Child Health programme in Unakoti district

Different programmes are being implemented for ensuring medical service in different areas of Unakoti district under National Child Health programme. Under the scheme, the patients aged below 18 years suffering from congenital disease, development problem or physical disability are being treated free of cost. Vaccination programme was organized by the mobile health team of RGM Hospital of Unakoti district at Fultali Panchayat office on December 5. Moreover, identification of congenital defect among the children has been done in Dalugao Bazaar Anganwadi centre and Bhagyapur Anganwadi centre. Dr. Sunita Das and ANM Jhuma Kar checked health condition of 19 children in these two Anganwadi centres.
