Zone, Destination Tripura Summit etc., Single Window Sytem for Ease of Doing Business policy. He informed, in order to make the skilled manpower self-reliant an online portal namely Karmakshetra is in the making. Similarly the chief minister also reviewed various programmes under industry and commerce department and directorate of skill development.

Assistance for fish farming by Kanchanpur sub-division fishery supervisor's office
