175 graduate teachers and 65 postgraduate teachers to be appointed

One seventy-five graduate teachers and 65 post-graduate teachers will be appointed. A request on this issue has been sent by the education department to TRBT. Education minister Ratanlal Nath has informed this during a press meet held at the conference hall of state secretariat on June 8, 2020. He has also informed that 42 UGT and 15 GTs will be appointed in primary section. A request has been sent to TRBT for selection of the names from the waiting list of TET examination held by TBRT for primary education. The education department will take initiative for appointment after receiving the list of the names. Education minister expressed that the government has decided to appoint 40 persons in the post of Assistant Professor. Among them, 4 Assistant-Professors for Assistant-Professors for Bengali, 10 5 Assistant-Professors for English, Education subject, 5 Assistant-Professors for History, 4 Assistant-Professors for Political Science, 4 Assistant-Professors for Sanskrit, 4 Assistant-Professors for Physiology, 2 Assistant Professors for Geology and 2 Assistant-Professors for Botany will be appointed. He said that

recruitment to these posts will be done through TPSC.

Loan disbursement camp for MSME at Rabindra Shatabarshiki Bhavan

The chief minister has urged the micro, and medium (MSME) small, entrepreneurs to build Atmanirbhar Tripura in line with the Atmanirbhar Bharat announced by the Prime Minister, after inaugurating a loan disbursement camp at Rabindra Shatabarshiki Bhavan yesterday. The chief minister said, incentive will be given to encourage the entrepreneurs in the state to boost industrial development. He said, during 2017-18 the centre and state jointly provided Rs. 8 crore incentive for industrial development. The present government also gave Rs. 18 crore incentive in 2018-19 and Rs. 29.23 crore incentive in 2019-20.

Under the Atmanirbhar Bharat scheme there is provision for Rs. 3 lakh crore non-collateral loan for MSME sector. In addition, 20 per cent loan on the pending loan can be availed from the banks. The chief minister drew attention of the banks so that they do not pressurize the MSME entrepreneurs for loan guarantee. Besides, the state government has identified 1 lakh small shop owners to

provide trade license to them. This will facilitate loan and insurance for them. Welcome address was given by the secretary of industry and commerce department Kiran Gitte. On this occasion the chief minister handed over loan sanction letter of different banks to the beneficiaries.
