Health and Nutrition Day along with health camp was held on February 5 at Gachirampara primary health centre in Naisingpara RR camp under Unakoti District with the presence of 25 pregnant women and their kids. Among them 7 pregnant women and 12 kids were vaccinated. In the camp Dr. Elisa Reang discussed about the importance of timely vaccination, taking care of the pregnant mother, family planning and the benefits of hospital delivery. participated in the programme. Among them, 23 were tested for anemia and malaria. Anemia was detected in 3 persons and no malaria virus was found in anyone. In the camp, Dr. Riya Bhadra, Medical Officer-in-Charge of Samrurpar primary health center, examined the health of the patients and laboratory technician Raju Sinha examined the blood samples. Nutritious food was distributed to everyone along with free medicines for the patients. Health workers, ASHA and Anganwadi workers of Murtichhara Sub-Health Center, played an important role in making this health camp a success. Plans and achievements of agriculture department reviewed
