President launches two passenger trains in Tripura

With this the service of Train no. 12097/12098 Agartala-Jiribam-Agartala Janashatabdi train has been extended till Khongsang, Manipur, whereas service of Train no. 02518/02517 Guwahati-Kolkata-Guwahati Express train has been extended till Agartala. Expressing her satisfaction after laying the foundation stone of the National Law University here vesterday, the President said that this university will play an important role in the study of law not only in the North Eastern region but also in the entire country. She said that the youth of the country has already achieved a lot of success in the field of information and technology. Agartala IIIT will play a significant role in information and technology education following the National Education Policy in future.

At the programme, President Droupadi Murmu said that not only higher education but also primary education should be given priority for the progress and development of the country. Referring to the Vidyajyoti Mission project, she expressed hope that this project will play an important role in the field of education.

She said that there is a huge potential for the development of Tripura and the North-East region. The ongoing work to improve road, air and rail connectivity in the region will further contribute to the development of the region. The development of trade and tourism in this region will also speed up. She expressed hope that the two train services that she was supposed to inaugurate next day will also improve connectivity in the North-East. Referring to Tripura's close relationship with poet Rabindranath

Tagore, the President said, the royal family had a close relationship with Gurudev who stayed at Pushpabanta Palace several times during his visit in the state. She hoped that the foundation stone of the Pushpabanta Palace Museum would play a major role in strengthening the traditional culture of the state.

Speaking at the programme, Chief Minister Prof. (Dr.) Manik Saha said, we are very happy that the President is visiting Tripura even in her busiest time. This is her first visit to Tripura after becoming the President. The people of the state are welcoming her. The Chief Minister said that with the Marg Darshan of the Prime Minister and his right leadership, Tripura is moving forward along with other North Eastern states. As part of this process, Tripura Judicial Academy was inaugurated vesterday and the foundation stone of National Law University was laid. At the programme, President Droupadi Murmu virtually laid the foundation stones of 6 State Government and 1 Central Government projects and

inaugurated the MLA Residence at Capital Complex. All the projects that she laid the foundation stone for were – development of Jampui-Damchhara road, development of Jatanbari-Mandirghat road via Tirthamukh, Maharaja Birendra Kishore Manikya Museum and Cultural Centre at Pushpabanta Palace, Durbar Hall and associated buildings, multi-storied а building at Gorkha basti, 6 higher secondary schools at different places in Tripura, development of 6 schools infrastructure, 9 boys/girls hostels with 100 seats and Indian Institute of Information Technology Agartala. At the programme, Chief Minister Prof. (Dr.) Manik Saha welcomed the President with traditional Risa of the state and presented her a memento. Education Minister Ratan Lal Nath and Tourism Minister Pranajit Singha Roy were also present at the programme.

Inauguration of MLA hostel & foundation stone laid for 7 projects

President of India, Droupadi Murmu inaugurated the newly constructed MLA hostel at Capital Complex yesterday. The President virtually inaugurated the MLA hostel and unveiled the foundation stone of 7 projects from Rabindra Satabarshiki Bhavan. The MLA hostel has been constructed under the supervision of PWD over an area of 3983 square meters. Rs 52.15 crore has been spent for construction of the MLA hostel. There are 45 suites, library, gymnasium, hall, meeting hall and waiting hall etc. facilities in the MLA hostel.

The President unveiled foundation stone of the proposed upgraded Manpui to Damcherra road of 29.123 km length and the width of the road will be expanded from 3.30 metre to 5.50 metre. Rs 84.79 crore is the estimated cost of development of this road under North East Road Sector Development Scheme (NERSDS). The 14.5 km long Jatanbari-Mandirghat road via Tirthamukh will also be widened from 3.30 metre to 5.50 metre. Rs 50.79 crore has been estimated for construction of the road under North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS). Maharaja Birendra Kishore Manikya Museum and Cultural Centre with various modern facilities will be built at a cost of Rs. 40.13 crore.

President also laid the foundation stone of a 15 storied administrative building at Gurkhabasti. The upcoming multi-storey building over an area of 16,545 square metre will be housing offices of various departments of the state government. The estimated cost of the building is Rs. 126.00 crore. The infrastructure of 6 schools will be developed at a cost of Rs 52.02 crore. Hostel with 100 seat facility

in 9 schools will be constructed at a cost of Rs 54.81 crore. These two projects will be implemented with the fund of DONER Ministry. The foundation stone of the permanent campus of Indian Institute of Information Technology (IIIT) at Khowai Chowmuhani of Mohanpur was also laid on this occasion. This project will be implemented as a joint venture of the Central Government, State Government, ONGC and NEEPCO. For this, the State government has provided 50 acres of land and the expenditure of the project has been estimated at Rs 118 crore.
