10,132 farmers benefitted in Kanchanpur under PM-KISAN Yojana

10 thousand 132 farmers from Dasda, Laljuri and Jampuihill block areas of Kanchanpur agricultural sub-division got their names registered under PM-KISAN Yojana. Each farmer is being given Rs. 6000 in three installments, that is Rs. 2000 in every instalment. 6 thousand 14 farmers of Dasda block area have registered their names. Among them, 6 thousand 14 farmers were given first and second installments and 5 thousand 761 farmers were given their third installments.

2 thousand 282 farmers of Laljuri block area have registered their names. Among them, 1 thousand 418 farmers were given first installments, 1 thousand 409 farmers were given second installments and 1 thousand 239 farmers were given their third installments. 1 thousand 736 farmers of Jampui hill block area have registered their names. Among them, 1 thousand 836 farmers were given first installment, 1 thousand 756 farmers were given second installments and 1 thousand 723 farmers were given their third installments. This information was given by the farmers welfare and agriculture department, North Tripura district office.

Relief distribution for poor in COVID-19 time

Relief items were distributed by the All Tripura SC Officers Welfare Society with the financial assistance of CSR fund of ONGC, Tripura Asset among the economically weaker people affected by COVID-19 in four places on December 12 and 13.
