Chief Minister's Discretionary Grant limit hiked

The state government has decided to increase the Chief Minister's Discretionary Grant from Rs. 1 lakh to Rs. 10 lakh. This decision was taken in the state cabinet meeting on January 14, 2021 by way of sixth amendment of the Chief Minister's Discretionary Grant Rules. After the cabinet meeting the education minister Ratan Lal Nath informed about the decision at a press meet held at the secretariat on January 14.

The education minister informed that the Sixth Amendment also incorporated the issue of financial benefits in case of accidental death / injury and death due to COVID-19. Earlier these were not a part of

the Chief Minister's Discretionary Grant Rules. He also informed that offer letters to 1468 teachers will be issued after January 20, 2021. Among them 897 will be for Graduate Teachers and 571 will be for Under-graduate Teacher posts. In this context the minister said, the education department sought 1,725 Under-graduate and 2,116 Graduate teachers from TRBT. For the rest of teachers i.e. 1,219 Graduate and 1,154 Undergraduate teachers the education department asked the TRBT to taken initiative for TET examination.

Very soon 18 more Under-Graduate and 11 Graduate teachers will posted, informed the education minister. They were issued offer letters earlier. He said, the education department has also taken initiative to appoint those who had cleared the Central TET and the matter of appointing those who cleared TET but their age limit has elapsed is also being considered. He said, January 18, onward classes for third and fourth standard will resume.

State physician brings accolades with her paper
