

5,413 Families to be covered under AJM in Ambassa & Ganganagar

DWS department has started work with the target of giving drinking water connections to 5,413 families of Ambassa and Ganganagar block during the current financial year under Atal Jaladhara Mission. So far free water connections have been provided to 189 families of these two blocks, informed Hiranmoy Chakma, executive engineer of DWS, Dhalai office.

He also informed that as per target water connections will be given to 5,020 families of Ambassa block and so far 73 families have been covered. Target is there to provide water connections to 393 families of Ganganagar bloc and so far 116 families have been covered. He also informed that during the 2020-21 financial year 3,425 families were covered under the scheme in Ambassa block and 387 families were covered in Ganganagar block.

Initiative for organic farming in Dukli block

During the 2020-21 financial year Dukli Panchayat Samiti, from its own income,

has prepared 8 kani fellow land for organic farming. Cultivation of Dragon fruit and different vegetables has started there. Besides, a pond has been dug in this land. Rs. 9 lakh has been spent in this project. To encourage the farmers free training on organic farming has been arranged for them. With the implementation of this scheme Dukli Panchayat Samiti has earned Rs. 89,334 during last year. Dukli block source has informed this.

Assistance for animal rearing in Dukli block

During the 2020-21 financial year house for animal rearing and structure for vegetable cultivation have been constructed for 18 poor families in different gram panchayats of Dukli block under MGNREGA. In addition, 28.962 km. road has been covered with brick soling in different gram panchayats under the same scheme.

For rearing ducks house has been constructed for eight families, for goat rearing three families and pig rearing two families have been given house.

Additionally structure has been constructed for six families for vegetable cultivation. Total Rs. 16,70,950 has been spent in implementation of all these. Through these activities 16,025 mandays have been generated, informed Dukli block source.

House for 30 families in Subhashnagar under PMAY (R)

Houses have been constructed for 30 families in Subhashnagar ADC village of Dasda block in Kanchanpur subdivision under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (rural) during the financial year 2019-20. Rs one lakh 30 thousand has been spent for construction of each house. Moreover, 382 toilets have been constructed in Subhashnagar village during the financial

year 2020-21 under Swachh Bharat Mission. It is noteworthy that 89 toilets were constructed in the village during the financial year 2019-20 under Swachh Bharat Mission. Subhashnagar ADC Village Committee officer has informed this.

Paddy procurement in Jirania

7 lakh 52 thousand 887 kg paddy was procured at MSP Rs 18.68 from the farmers of Jirania sub division. 6,06,244 kg of paddy was procured from 392 farmers at Madhabbari government food godown from July 3 to July 10. And at the ground near Krishnamala Open stage of Old Agartala block 1,46,643 kg paddy was procured from 119 farmers on 11th and 12th July. This was informed by the food, civil supplies and consumer affairs department office, Jirania.

Assistance for fish farming in Charilam block under PMSY

Ponds are being dug for fish farmers in Charilam block under Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana. New ponds will be dug for two families in Ramchhara gram panchayat and two families in North Charilam gram panchayat and Chelikhala village under the scheme. Three hectare

water area in the block will be covered under the scheme. Rs 3,20,000 will be spent for this purpose. Moreover, assistance will be provided to seven families in Brajapur gram panchayat, South Charilam gram panchayat, Rangmala village and Ramnagar village for biofloc fish farming. Rs 3,50,000 will be spent for this purpose.

27,143 families of Dhalai district to be brought under CMSPY

27 thousand 143 families of Dhalai district will be brought under Chief Minister Swanirbhar Parivar Yojana by the horticulture and soil conservation department for vegetable cultivation. Each beneficiary will be distributed different types of vegetable seeds worth 50 rupees to make them financially self-reliant. Among them 5 thousand 369 families are from Durga Chowmuni block, 3 thousand 503 are from Salema block, 3 thousand 55 are from Ambassa block, 1 thousand 8 families are from Ganganagar block, 3 thousand 485 families are from Dumboor nagar block, 1 thousand 616 are from Raishyabari block, 6 thousand 325 are from Manu block and 2 thousand 782 families are from Chawmanu block. This

was informed by the deputy director Alok Kumar Das, horticulture and soil conservation office, Dhalai district.
