

20th State-Level Buisu Festival 2022 concluded

The two-day 20th State-Level Buisu Festival 2022 organized by Tripura Chubalai Buthu concluded at Hokutwisa English Medium Higher Secondary School Ground in Dhumucherra under Longtharai Valley of Dhalai district on April 14. Royal Scion Pradyot Kishore Manikya graced the closing ceremony of Buisu Festival as an inaugurator. Other dignitaries having graced the occasion were Member of Parliament Rebati Tripura, Naran (head of Tripura Society) Birendra Tripura, MLA Dhananjay Tripura.

Royal Scion Pradyot Kishore Manikya in the programme greeted everyone on the occasion of Buisu Festival and lauded the organizers for organizing such event. Folk music, dance, traditional games and sports, awareness-based seminar, cultural exhibition etc., were the attraction of the two-day festival. Drinking water source created in Amarpur

Four water tanks were constructed for creating drinking water sources under MLA Area Development Scheme in Amarpur block under MLA Ranjit Das. Two submersible pump sets were installed in Tutbagan and Lokshrima Para of Kumracherra ADC Village of Amarpur block under the scheme. Each submersible pump set was installed at the cost of 2 lakh 93 thousand rupees. Drinking water tank were also constructed in Kartikpara, Sunderbanpara, of

Bhomracherra village, Tutbagan Para of Kumracherra village and Burburiya village. Each drinking water tank was constructed at the cost of 1 lakh 53 thousand 794 rupees. This was informed by Amarpur Block office.

Road construction in Amarpur under MLA Area Development Scheme

Construction of various roads is ongoing under MLA Area Development Scheme to improve connectivity in different Gram Panchayat and villages of Amarpur block under MLA Sindhu Chandra Jamatia. Through this, three Brick Soling roads are being constructed in the block at the cost of 7 lakh 90 thousand 94 rupees.

Apart from this, 5 OHP (Humid Oxidization with Peroxide) were installed for creation of drinking water sources in West Dalak Panchayat at the cost of 63 thousand 505 rupees. Rest houses are being constructed for passengers at Gajan Chowmuni of East Malbasa village and Garia Mission Khulum Academy of Burburiya village. Each rest house is being built at the cost of 3 lakh 68 thousand 244 rupees. This was informed by Amarpur Block office.

Review meeting for one-day Health Fair in Santirbazar

A review meeting was held today at the conference hall of Community Health



Centre, Jolaibari. The meeting was chaired by Chairman of Jolaibari Panchayat Samiti Rabi Nama in presence of Jolaibari Block BDO Dr Abhijit Das.

During the meeting Medical Officer-In-Charge of Jolaibari Community Health Centre Dr Binita Chakma announced that it is going to organize Block level Health Fair on April 20 as a part of celebration of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahaotsav under the guidance of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW). The one-day Health Fair will be organized at Kalibari JB School premises, Jolaibari which would be a platform to offer an array of Health services free of cost and generate awareness about different schemes of the government.

Today it was also announced that a Block level Health mela will be organised from

April 18 to April 22 as a continuation of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahaotsav, under the guidance of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW). The Mela will be organized at all the PHCs and CHCs at the block level and it would be a platform to offer bouquet of Health services free of cost and enhance awareness about different schemes/programmes of the government.

The main objective of the Block Level Health Fair is to build awareness about different health programmes, increase health awareness for prevention of various communicable, and non-communicable diseases and motivate the people to adopt good health habits to stay healthy and provide screening for early diagnosis, basic health care services with relevant health specialists and referrals as needed.

The Medical Officer In-Charge informed that the Block Level Health Fair would be held in collaboration with Jolaibari RD Block and line departments of the state government. About 31 stalls on health related services and awareness based information will be provided during the Health Fair. Different line department officials and local dignitaries were also present in the meeting.
