

Drinking water connection to 4,788 families in Jampuijala

Till date 4 thousand 788 families have been provided with clean drinking water connection through pipelines under Jal Jeevan Mission in Jampuijala sub-division. In the previous financial year, 3 thousand 615 families were given clean drinking water connections through pipelines. In the present financial year, so far 1 thousand 173 families have been given drinking water connections. This information was collected from SDO Bakul Debbarma, Takarjala sub division, drinking water & sanitation department.

17 new water bodies in west district under RKVY

17 New water bodies have been created in the present financial year in West Tripura district by the initiative of fisheries department under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana. Under this scheme, two water bodies in Sadar sub division, six water bodies in Jirania sub division, nine water bodies in Mohanpur sub division have been created. Through this, 2.72 Ha water area of the district has been newly brought under Pisciculture. Apart from this, under Chief Minister Swanirbhar Parivar Yojana 880 families of Sadar sub division, 2,124 families of Jirania sub

division and 1,686 families of Mohanpur sub division were distributed 500 fish fingerlings each. In Forest Rights Act recognized areas of Jirania sub division, 75 fish farmers were given fish fingerlings. Total expenditure was 5.40 lakh rupees. This information was collected from west district fisheries office.

7 Deep tube wells in Ganganagar block

With the initiative of drinking water and sanitation department, seven deep tube wells were installed in Ganganagar block of Dhalai district in the previous financial year. Around 70 lakh rupees was spent in installing each deep tube well as informed by the DWS executive engineer Hiranmoy Chakma. He also informed that in the present financial year, more five deep tube wells will be installed in Ganganagar block. Work is going on to install two deep tube wells presently.

1.75 Ha waterbody in Padmabil block brought under fish pollen production

1.75 Ha water body in Padmabil block was brought under fish pollen production by the fisheries department under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana. Under this, 11 fish farmers of different village areas of the block were given 800 CC fish pollen for

fish pollen farming in 0.16 Ha water body. Total expenditure was 2 lakh 50 thousand rupees per hectare as informed by the fisheries development officer Sanjib Debbarma. He also informed that three beneficiaries of Rasarajnar village, three beneficiaries of Twihasing village, two beneficiaries of Akhrabari village and three beneficiaries of Upendranagar village will be benefitted under this initiative.

Assistance for animal rearing in South Panisagar under CMSPY

Piglet and goat cubs have been distributed by the animal resources development department under Chief Minister Swanirvar Parivar Yojana on September 14. Pradhan of South Panisagar Gram Panchayat Kanu Mahisya Das, veterinary doctor Dr. Sanjoy Kumar Das, Panchayat sGopal Das and elected

members of the Panchayat were present in the distribution programme held at the premises of South Panisagar Gram Panchayat office in Panisagar block. On this occasion, one piglet has been provided to each of 12 beneficiaries and one cub has been provided to each of six beneficiaries of South Panisagar Gram Panchayat. Rs 7500 per beneficiary has been spent for this purpose. Total one lakh 35 thousand rupees has been spent for this purpose.

Training on Biofloc fish culture in Nalchar

A three-day training on Biofloc fish culture organized by the fishery department has started from September 14 at the conference hall of Melaghar Municipal Council. The programme was inaugurated by MLA Subhash Das. He urged people to become self dependant through fish cultivation in Biofloc system. Moreover, chairman of poverty elevation related standing committee of Sepahijala Zilla Parishad Ratan Das delivered speech. Deputy director of fisheries department Kshitish Debbarma and fisheries superintendent Kamal Hossen and other officers discussed on Biofloc fish cultivation related different subjects. 75 fish cultivators of Kathalia, Boxanagar, Mohanbhog and Nalchar blocks have participated in the training programme.
