Farmers Knowledge Centres are being set up in the state to double agricultural produce using scientific and modern processes, enunciated agriculture and farmers' welfare minister Pranajit Singha Roy after inaugurating Farmers а Knowledge Centre at Jolaibari yesterday. The centre was built spending 58 lakh 71 thousand rupees under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana under the initiative of farmers welfare agriculture and department.

Agriculture minister said, several central and state government schemes are being implemented such as PMKISAN, PMFBY, RKVY, PMKSY etc. The state government is working on 10 different small projects for farmers and agriculture in South Tripura

Agriculture minister inaugurated seed processing centre in Sabroom

Agriculture and farmers' welfare minister Pranajit Singha Roy inaugurated two rice godowns near Sabroom Railway Station under Rupaichari and Satchand blocks of Sabroom sub-division yesterday. Each rice godown has 1 thousand MT capacity and each of them was built spending 1 crore 25 lakh rupees. He also inaugurated a seed processing centre near Sabroom Railway Station which has been built spending 53 lakh 4 thousand rupees.

At a farmers' meet organized on the occasion, agriculture minister said, the present government has taken several initiatives to increase agricultural production in the state and to double farmers' income. Farmers are getting 6 thousand rupees directly into their bank account under PMKISAN scheme. Efforts are being made to double farmers' income through paddy procurement from them. The whole agriculture system including fertilizers, pesticides, irrigation system, soil testing is being given importance. The government is not only looking after increasing production but also on its marketing. Queen Pineapples, Jackfruits, Scented Lemons are being exported abroad. 10 rice godowns are being inaugurated in South Tripura. These rice godowns shall work as paddy procurement centres in coming days, he informed.

Others present in the programme were MLA Sankar Roy, Sabhadhipati of South Tripura Zilla Parishad Kakali Das Dutta. The programme was presided over by the president of agriculture related standing committee of Satchand block Jaba Dey.

Fertilizer and seed godown inaugurated in Belonia

Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Pranajit Singha Roy inaugurated fertilizer and seed godown in Belonia under South Tripura district yesterday. agricultural production has risen after enrolling the farmers under PMKISAN and Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana.

He hoped that this godown will play a significant role in farmers overall development. The fertilizer godown has 3 thousand MT capacity. It was built spending 2 crore 81 lakh rupees. The paddy godown has the capacity of 1 thousand MT. It was built spending 1 crore 25 lakh rupees. The seed godown has 200 MT capacity. It was built spending 19 lakh 88 thousand rupees and 7 lakh 57 thousand rupees was spent in seed processing scheme.
