Survey underway to declare TB free districts before March 24

The world is going to observe World TB Day on March 24. Aiming at declaring four

districts of the state as TB-free before that day the Community Medicine department of Agartala Government Medical College has started a survey. With them has joined hands the National TB Control programme, Tripura. The Agartala Government Medical College has launched this survey with the help of World Health Organisation (WHO), Indian Council of Medical Research. National Institute of Epidemiology, Chennai and Indian Association of Preventive and Social Medicine. Dr. Subrata Baidya has been appointed as the nodal officer for the entire work and for the four districts (North, South, Dhalai and West) to be covered nodal officers will be Asst. Prof. Dr. Chhanda Mog, Associate Prof. Dr. Rituparna Das Associate Prof. Dr. Amar Tripura and Asst. Prof. Dr. Sampa Das respectively.

For the survey, five clusters have been made in each district and 30 TB patients will be identified in every district. To conduct the survey Senior Treatment Supervisor (STS), Senior TB Laboratory Supervisor (STLS) and MPWs have been engaged. To monitor the preparations Dr. Sapna from the Central TB Division had visited the state on February 13. From February 9-13 West Tripura district nodal officer Dr. Sampa Das visited door to door to monitor the survey work in Ward no. 13 of Agartala Municipal Corporation. Nodal officer of South Tripura district Dr. Rituparna Das and state nodal officer Dr. Subrata Baidya also went out for field visits. The family welfare and

preventive medicines department has informed this.

State level Wangala Festival opens at Natintilla
