Different hospitals nominated for Kayakalp Award

Like every year, this year also, District **Sub-Divisional** Hospitals, Hospitals, Primary Health Centre, Community Health Centres, Health and Wellness Centres and Health Sub-Centres of the state were nominated for State-Level Kayakalp Award through tri-level survey based on cleanliness in the hospital, proper waste discharge and germ-free environment.
