

Pre-recorded lectures to be telecast on DDK-Agartala from July 25

Pre-recorded classes of class X and XII on different subjects under TBSE will be telecast by the secondary education department on Agartala Doordarshan Kendra from July 25. These classes will be telecast from July 25 to August 18. Inauguration of outlets of Heart & Humanity at GB Bazar & Radhanagar

The second outlet of Heart and Humanity of Purbodaya was inaugurated by the deputy chief minister Jishnu Dev Varma at GB Bazar on July 23, 2020. Purbodaya, an NGO is working for social welfare. The NGO has set up three outlets. It acts as a platform through which both NGOs and common people can donate things such as food products, clothes, etc. by placing those in the outlets and these will be distributed among poor people through the outlets. The donate items can be collected by any underprivileged person in need of that item free of cost. The identity

of both the donor, and the beneficiary will be kept secret.

The tourism minister Pranajit Singha Roy, attending the programme, expressed that this initiative would solve the issue of food and cloth of the poor people to some extent. Among others present there included the commissioner of AMC Shailesh Yadav, social activist Dr. Manik Saha, Dr. Ashok Sinha, proprietor of Teresa Diagnosis Centre Asish Sen and president of Purbodaya social organization Alaka Sinha. The general secretary of the organisation Niti Deb delivered welcome address. Saplings of sandal, Rudrakhsa, and bamboo made craft items were handed over to the guests before starting the programme. A souvenir was handed over by the deputy chief minister Jishnu Dev Varma to the sponsor of the outlet, Asish Sen. Towards the end of the programme the guests handed over essential items to some poor people.

The third outlet of Heart and Humanity sponsored jointly by Purbodaya and Smart City Mission was inaugurated by the revenue Minister NC Debbarma at Radha Nagar motor stand. In the programme, Niti Deb and secretary of the urban development department Kiran Gitte delivered speech. The president of Purbodaya, Alaka Sinha and other guests

were present in the programme. The guests distributed educational items, clothes, and food among the poor at the end of the programme.

8,180 mandays generated in Dharmanagar under TUEP

8,180 mandays have been generated in Dharmanagar Municipal Council area under TUEP during the current year up to the month of June. Rs 14 lakh 47 thousand 860 has been spent for this purpose. Under the scheme, renovation of road, cleaning drain and jungle have been done in this municipal area. 926 TUEP job card holders of the municipal area have availed employment through this. The Darmanagar Municipal Council source has informed this.

233 Power tillers distributed in Gomati district

Under the initiative of the agriculture and farmers' welfare department 233 power tillers were distributed among the farmers in Gomati district under the National Mission Scheme during the 2019-20 financial year. The power tillers were distributed at subsidized rates. The beneficiary break-up was like this – 13 farmers from Matabari block, nine farmers from Tepania block, 15 farmers from Kakraban block, 27 farmers from Killa

block, 65 farmers from Amarapur lock, 45 farmers from Karbook block and seven farmers from Silachari block. This information has been divulged by the district agriculture and farmers' welfare office.

Paddy procurement in Panisagar concludes

The process of paddy procurement at minimum support price by the food, civil supplies and consumer affairs and agriculture and farmers' welfare department in North district ended on July 22. The procurement was done from the farmers of Panisagar and Jubarajnar block. During the period from July 18 to July 22 paddy was purchased from 53 farmers of the said blocks at the Panisagar regulated market. It is noteworthy that in total 60.483 MT paddy was purchased from the farmers at the rate of Rs. 18.15 per kg. the Panisagar agriculture supervisor's office has informed this.
