

## **Free food grain distributed PMGKAY in Khowai**

A programme for distribution of food grain free of cost under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana was held at New town hall on 27<sup>th</sup> April, 2022. The programme was organised by Khowai subdivisional administration in association with food, civil supplies & consumers affairs department. The programme was inaugurated by Vice-Chairman of Khowai Panchayat Samiti Tapash Kanti Das. He appealed to all to build a corruption-free public distribution system. Sabhadhipati of Zilla Parishad Joydeb Debbarma as chief guest of the programme stated that public distribution system should be strengthened with honesty, sincerity and service mentality. Saha- Sabhadhipati of Zilla Parishad Hari Shankar Paul also spoke on the occasion. Among other dignitaries, member of Zilla Parishad Joli Barman, Chairman of Khowai Panchayat Samiti Tinku Bhattacharjee, SDM Asit Kumar Das were present in the programme. Guests handed over the packets of food grain to 12 persons from different areas of the subdivision in the programme.

E-card has been provided to 1,99, 937 beneficiaries of Sepahijala district under

Ayushman Bharat- Pradhan Mantri Jana Arogya Yojana. Among Them, 1,77,184 beneficiaries have availed health service under the scheme till now. Health service of Ayushman Bharat smart card is being provided in almost 19 hospitals of the district. 17,009 beneficiaries of the district have availed facility of this smart card during the last financial year. Rs 118.40 lakh under the health department was spent for this purpose. CMO office of the district has informed this.

## **DWS Minister in a review meeting of Jal Jeevan Mission in ADC areas**

Clean drinking water connection has to reach every house in the remote areas of the state under Jal Jeevan Mission, stated drinking water & sanitation minister Sushanta Choudhury in a review meeting on progress of Jal Jeevan Mission in ADC areas held at the conference hall of TTAADC administrative office in Khumulwng yesterday. He said, water is essential for survival and improves quality of living, which is why the work plan to provide clean drinking water connection to every household under Jal Jeevan Mission. Our state government is working with this kind of thought, so that no one goes neglected from getting drinking water connection under Jal Jeevan Mission. He also directed the officials that

water supply must be transported through tankers to the remote areas where supply of water through pipeline is not possible yet so that people may not suffer, especially in the dry season of summer. DWS Minister also directed to complete the pending works of creating water sources and to dig more water sources in 2022.

Chairman of TTAADC Advisory Committee Pradyot Kishore Manikya Debbarma also was present in the meeting. He directed the officials to bring more tribal areas under Jal Jeevan Mission and to maintain the quality of water. He also emphasized upon water conservation and excavation of water bodies. TTAADC CEM Purna Chandra Jamatia in the meeting said, Jal Jeevan Mission is a noble scheme. He emphasized upon installing more mini deep tube wells and on starting solar energy usage in areas where power connection has not reached yet.

Secretary of DWS department Kiran Gitte in the meeting said, at present, drinking water is being transported to 3 lakh 82 thousand 316 families of ADC areas of 8 districts of the state under Jal Jeevan Mission. Among those families, 47,822 families are of North Tripura district, 32,947 families are of West Tripura district, 47,613 families are of Unakoti district, 36,753 families are of Gomati

district, 65,632 families are of South Tripura district, 45,258 families are of Khowai district, 54,848 families are of Dhalai district and 51,743 families are of Sepahijala district. He also informed that 1126 deep tube wells, 2,359 small bores, 23 surface water treatment plants, 387 iron removal plants were installed under different schemes and 28 innovative schemes were started to transport water to ADC areas of the state.

TTAADC Deputy CEM Animesh Debbarma also participated in the discussion of the review meeting. Other dignitaries present in the meeting were TTAADC MDC Kamal Kalai, MDC Bhabaranjan Reang, Chairpersons of ADC Zonal Office of 8 districts of the state and officials of DWS department. The officials briefed about the progress of drinking water supply programme in their respective areas in the review meeting.

**Pucca houses for 180 families of Sonaram ADC village under PMAY-G**

Pucca houses have been constructed for 180 families of Sonaram ADC village of Hejamara block under Pradan Mantri Awas Yojana-Gramin during the last financial year. Rs 1.30 lakh was spent for construction of each house. Moreover, different development schemes were implemented in this village under MGNREGA during the last financial year.

Pond digging and pond renovation, crop field levelling, construction of new road, renovation of old road and creation of irrigation source were among these. Rs 69 lakh 10 thousand 747 has been spent for this purpose. 31,377 mandays were generated and 430 families benefited. Sonaram village office has informed this.

### **Multi-purpose Indoor Sports Hall for Shantipur JB School**

In the present financial year under Border Area Development Programme, a multi-purpose Indoor Sports Hall will be built for Shantipur JB School of East Bhandarima Village in Dasda block. The cost has been estimated to be 39 lakh 99 thousand rupees. Apart from this, in the present financial year under this scheme, Khatlang Village Community Hall will be built in Jampuihill block. The cost has been estimated to be 20 lakh rupees. This was informed by Kanchanpur RD Division Office.

### **Pucca houses to 119 families of Kangrai ADC Village under PMAY-G**

In the financial year 2021-22 under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Gramin scheme, permission has been granted to construct Pucca houses for 119 families of Kangrai ADC Village of Dasda block. 1 lakh

30 thousand rupees will be spent on building each house. Apart from that, Pucca houses have been constructed for 51 families of Khumpui ADC Village of the block. This was informed by Dasda Block Office.

### **Walking aids given to Divyangans in Amarpur**

Walking aids were given to 22 Divyangans in Amarpur. MLA Ranjit Das handed over walking aids to the Divyangans through a Block Level Health Fair programme held on April 26 at New Town Hall in Amarpur. Other dignitaries present during the distribution were Chairperson of Amarpur Nagar Panchayat Bikash Roy and Amarpur BAC Chairman Sumant Reang. Walking aids were given on behalf of Social Welfare & Social Education department.

### **Assistance for production of fish fingerlings in Rupaichari block under RKVY**

In the present financial year under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana, mixed fish seeds were distributed to 10 families of Rupaichari block for production of fish fingerlings. Each family was given 800 CC of mixed fish seeds. Apart from that, 18 families were given 800 Pabda fingerlings for farming Pabda species of fish besides farming Carp fish. 1,500 Carp fingerlings

were distributed. Total 3 lakh 60 thousand rupees was spent in implementation of this distribution program. This was informed by Fisheries office, Rupaichari block.

### **New water bodies created in Charilam block under RKVY**

Water bodies were created for fish farming in Charilam block under Rasthriya Krishi Vikas Yojana. These water bodies were created in Ramchara, South Charilam, Brajpur Gram panchayat of the block and Bathanmura, Bashtali, Amtali and Chelikhola ADC village. 14 fish farmers have benefited through this. Apart from that, ponds were dug for four families of the block under the scheme. Beneficiary families were given fish fingerlings, necessary medicines and fish feed. Total 2 lakh 24 thousand rupees was spent in the implementation.

### **Section 144 imposed in Term-II Secondary & Higher Secondary exam centres of Longtharai Valley**

For smooth and peaceful conduction of Term-II Secondary and forthcoming Higher Secondary examination under Tripura Board Secondary Examination, Section 144 has been imposed within the

jurisdiction of four exam centres areas under Longtharai Valley sub-division. SDM Amartya Barman announced sub-sections 2 of Section 144 of CRPC, 1973 being imposed in and around 200 metres of the notified examination centres- Chailengta HS School, Manughat HS School, Chawmanu HS School and 82 Miles Proper HS School under Longtharai Valley sub-division. For this, necessary restrictions have been imposed with effect from April 18, 2022 to May 6, 2022 for Term-II Secondary Examination and from May 2, 2022 to June 1, 2022 for Higher Secondary examination.

Assembling of five or more persons between 10am to 5pm is prohibited. Only security guards, police personnel on duty shall carry arms or any metal weapon. Use of loudspeakers, amplification in any form of contravention of settled norms and provisions in this respect is strictly prohibited. Restrictions are there on shouting slogans and similar conduct. Entry of anyone other than assigned officials, examiners, examinees are strictly prohibited from entering the exam centres. Violation of any order will be considered as a punishable offence under Section 188 of the Indian Penal Code.
