
Legal Services Camp in Hezamara block on March 30

ICAR conducted 3-day training programme in Bichandra Manu

A three-day training on 'Upscaling and Fish health Management in fish based integrated farming system cum inputs distribution' concluded on March 27 at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Birchandra Manu. The training programme was held from March 25 till March 27 under North East Hill Scheme at Birchandra Manu Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) under Santirbazar Sub-Division. The training programme was jointly organized by ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education and Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Birchandra Manu.

During the programme, trainers and experts demonstrated on fish based integrated farming and imparted some basic ideas to the participants to upscale the farming system and increase the

production, productivity and farmers income. Director of ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education Dr Ravi Shankar C.N. who was present in online mode said, the integrated farming system is very important for upliftment of farmers' livelihood and doubling farmer's income.

Head of KVK, South Tripura Dr Biswajit Debnath said, South Tripura KVK is determined to develop the district and is ready to extend all kinds of possible help to conduct such training programmes in near future. Experts present in the training programme delivered lectures on doubling farmers' income through fish based integrated farming, production management of fish and livestock and also on fish health management.

On the last day of the training, participants were distributed vermicomposting unit, fish seed, piglet, animal feed horticultural planting materials such as banana sampling etc. Around 40 farmers from 3 Self-Help Groups and one farmers' club of South Tripura District have participated in the three-day training programme.

2-day State-Level workshop on National Multidimensional Poverty Index
