Towers yesterday. Businessmen associated with Information and Technology business joined the Summit from Delhi, Kolkata and other parts of the country. Few pictorial presentations were given on IT business in Tripura vis-à-vis between India and Bangladesh.

The Chief Minister said, due to expansion of digital system in the state, speedy transparent administrative system has been created after 2018 which is serving the purpose to take the nation and the state ahead. He said, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has always been sincere in building friendly relationship with neighbouring countries, which is why the Prime Minister invited SAARC countries in oath taking ceremony in 2018. He also said, economy of both India and Bangladesh was running normal even after Covid-19 pandemic hit. It is being hoped that India's GDP will be 9% in this year's budget. The economy of both India and Bangladesh is based on Agriculture, which is why both the country's economy have been going strong even in difficult times. He said, at present there are few small IT companies functional in the state. There is favourable environment for IT sector in the state. The Chief Minister

invited all the investors present in the Summit to invest in the state. He also spoke about the plans to improve rail and air connectivity in the state.

Minister of State for Information and Communication Technology (ICT), Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh Zunaid Ahmed Palak in the Summit expressed his gratitude as India has provided 100 advanced ambulances, vaccines and oxygen to Bangladesh during Covid-19 pandemic. He said, Prime Minister of Bangladesh Sheikh Hasina has been working to make the country developed by 2041. tube wells in Bashtali village, to install 1 deep tube wells and 5 small bore deep tube wells in Bathanmura village, to install 2 deep tube wells and 2 small bore deep tube wells in Chelikhola village, to install 4 small bore deep tube wells in Dhariyathal village, to install 2 deep tube wells and 3 small bore deep tube wells in Padmanagar village, to install 2 deep tube wells and 2 small bore deep tube wells in Ramnagar village, to install 2 deep tube wells and 2 small bore deep tube wells in Rangmala village and to install 3 deep tube wells and 4 small bore deep tube wells in Sutarmura village.

Milk yield and calf rally programme in Bokafa block



Animal Resources Development Department organized a milk yield and calf rally programme at Betaga JB School

ground premises under Bokafa RD Block today. The programme was inaugurated by the Chairman of Panchayat Samiti of Bokafa RD Block Sridam Das in presence of President of Agri Standing Committee, Jolaibari Bulti Pal Choudhury.

Chairman of Panchayat Samiti of Bokafa RD Block Sridam Das said, such type of programmes are being organized to help rural people become self-sufficient through rearing cows by raising healthy calves.

Farmers of Betaga area and nearby villages took part in the calf rally with enthusiasm to showcase their calves. Most of the farmers were keen to learn more about health care and management practices to get better returns out of animal rearing. In the calf rally programme, experts explained the farmers about the best practices for ensuring better physical growth of their calves and to rear animals with better breed characteristics.

During the programme the farmers were advised on a variety of issues including genetic improvement of stock generation after generation, vaccinations, feeding, mineral supplementation, and green

fodder production round the year. In addition, three prizes were handed over to the winners for best calves in different categories during the programme. The calf rally was funded by Tripura Livestock Development Agency (TLDA).

Cultivation of medicinal plants in Gournagar block

Medicinal plants have been cultivated by Forest department in Gournagar block of Kailashahar subdivision during the last financial year. Sapling of Gandhaki has been planted in 5 hectare land under Jalai forest beat. Rs 1 lakh 9 thousand 785 has been spent for this purpose. Sapling of Nageshwar has been planted in one hectare land at the cost of Rs. 36 thousand 490.

Moreover, 5 hectare land has been covered under Cardamom cultivation at the cost of Rs 2 lakh 33 thousand 700. This programme has been implemented under Green Land Joint Forest Management Committee. Moreover, 10,000 saplings of Gandhaki has been planted under Unakoti forest beat. Subdivisional Forest Officer Khagendra Debbarma has informed this.
