

CM flags off vehicle carrying relief materials for Silchar today



With the initiative of Tripura Civil Service Officer's Association, a vehicle carrying relief materials has been sent off for Silchar, Assam and nearby flood affected areas. A truck carrying relief materials worth 10 lakh rupees collected by the Association was flagged off by the Chief Minister Prof. (Dr.) Manik Saha in front of Ujjayanta Palace today.

The Chief Minister said, humans stand by humankind in critical situations. It is the responsibility of every aware citizen. He lauded Tripura Civil Service Officer's Association for taking such initiative to extend helping hand for the flood victims in Silchar. He said, Tripura

140 Small bore wells to sink in West Tripura under PM Krishi Sinchai Yojana

Target has been set to sink 140 small bore wells in West Tripura district under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana during the current financial year. Out of the targeted number 132 small bore wells have already been sunk and 64 of them have been commissioned. The representative of water resources department informed this during a review meeting of West Tripura Zilla Parishad held yesterday. In addition, the source said, with the assistance of NABARD, target has been set to sink 17 deep tube wells under DWS scheme in the district. Out of this, six tube wells have been sunk

and work is on for another 11 tube wells. Out of the targeted 25 flood controlling dams, 16 have been constructed.

Adarsh Matritva Abhiyan to commence statewide tomorrow

To ensure health safety of pregnant women and the fetal child, Adarsh Matritva Abhiyan is to commence statewide tomorrow. This Abhiyan will continue till July 14. In the first phase of Adarsh Matritva Abhiyan, treatment facilities will be provided to 29 thousand 937 pregnant women in the state. This was informed by Tripura Mission Director, National Health Mission Dr. Sidharth Shiv Jaiswal in a press meet yesterday.

In the press meet, he said, the ASHA workers will go door to door for the first five days of the Abhiyan and will create a list of pregnant ladies. Besides, survey will be done as to whether reproducing families follow contraceptive ways in their family planning. All the names of the pregnant ladies in the UPHCs in the state will be registered in these five days. Apart from that, during the Abhiyan, pre-primary examination will be done on the pregnant ladies and will be given TB vaccination. A different list will be created for adolescent would-be parents in the UPHC during the Abhiyan. They would be

advised on new contraceptive ways for family planning.

Tripura Mission Director, National Health Mission Dr. Sidharth Shiv Jaiswal informed that a Community Health Officer, ANM will be there for health check-up of every pregnant lady during the Abhiyan. ASHA workers and Anganwadi workers will keep a check on the pregnant ladies. In any kind of situation, the local representatives will also stand by the pregnant ladies and will encourage them for institutional delivery. In this Abhiyan, an experienced doctor will be there for the check up of each pregnant lady. Intensive care will be taken for pregnant ladies with high risk. Besides that, pre delivery examination and ultrasonography (when necessary) will be done, iron folic acid and calcium tablets will be given to the pregnant ladies. Every pregnant lady will be brought under different government schemes such as Janani Suraksha Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Matri Vandana Yojana, Mukhyamantri Matru Pushti Upahar. State Program Officer of Reproductive Child Health Dr. Sanjay Rudrapal and State Immunization Officer Dr. Mousumi Sarkar were present in the press meet.
