

Madhyamik-H.S.-Madrasa results to be out on July 31

Results of Madhyamik, Higher Secondary, Madrasa Fajil and Madrasa Aalim examinations conducted by the Tripura Board of Secondary Education will be declared tomorrow. The chairman of TBSE will declare the results through a press conference at 12.30 pm tomorrow. Immediately after that, results will be available on the website of TBSE and SMS to the candidates, informed the education minister Ratan Lal Nath in a press meet yesterday at the secretariat. He informed that this year due to COVID pandemic examinations could not be held. A ten-member expert committee was constituted to evaluate the results of Madhyamik, H.S., Madrasa Fajil and Madrasa Aalim examinations.

The education minister also informed, this year a total of 46,613 regular, continue, external and compartmental candidates are there in Madhyamik, and 27,205 candidates are there in H.S. examination. He also said, neighbourhood classes are going on in 4,083 schools out of 4,423 schools of the state. In average 75,000 students are attending these classes daily.

Monthly mega inspection of RD works to commence on July 2

To ensure quality and timely inspection of all rural flagship programmes of the Government of India in the state, all RD works will be inspected the concerned state/district/block level officers on the first of day of every month or the first working day if the a holiday falls on the first day. It has been decided that the inspection will commence on August 2, 2021. Accordingly state level officers of RD and panchayat department have been assigned the district to be inspected. Apart from state level officers, all DM, ADMs, superintending engineers, executive engineers, BDOs, assistant engineers will conduct inspection works of MGNREGS, PMAY (G), TRLM, SPMRM schemes. 33 kv power substation in Katlamara

"Without hiking the tariffs, initiatives are being taken in mission mode to improve and expand power services in the state by the state government," said Deputy Chief Minister Jishnu Dev Varma after inaugurating 33 kv power substation at Katlamara in Simna. The power substation has been constructed spending 12 crore

40 lakh through Northeast Regional Power System Improvement Project. Deputy Chief Minister also said that this power substation was being constructed since 2018. Through this substation, 3 thousand 855 families of Simna, Brahmakunda, Panchabati, Katlamara, Sidhai and Daygabari will get power supply. He said that 34 power substations are under construction at present to improve power services all over the state. Recently total 9 power substations have been inaugurated so far including this one. Remaining power substations will be ready this December. Others present in the programme were Power department Secretary Kiran Gitte, TSECL Managing Director Dr. M.S Kele, Mohanpur SDM Subhash Dutta, TSECL Additional Managing Director Ranjan Debbarma.

Pucca toilets in 17 Anganwadi centres of Sabroom Nagar Panchayat

Pucca toilets have been constructed and drinking water supply facility has been created in 17 Anganwadi centres in the present financial year under the initiative of Sabroom Nagar Panchayat. Toilets were built spending total Rs. 7,48,204. On the other hand one toilet and a dressing room have been constructed for the workers of food godown under Sabroom Nagar Panchayat spending Rs. 1,32,237 . This

Social pension to 9,872 beneficiaries in Satchand block

9,872 Beneficiaries of Satchand block are being given social pensions under different central and state government schemes from the social welfare and social education department. Among them, 3,981 beneficiaries are getting pensions under NSP central government scheme and 5,891 persons are getting pension from state government schemes. 2,526 are male beneficiaries and 7, 346 are females. SC beneficiaries are 2,610, ST beneficiaries are 2,431, OBC beneficiaries are 2,235 and three are from minority community. Besides, 2,593 are general beneficiaries. 3,293 Beneficiaries are getting old age pension, 628 are getting widow pension and 60 are getting disability pension.
