



meeting of Fisheries Department held in Civil Secretariat on yesterday the Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb asserted this. The Chief Minister has presided over the meeting. He stated that the present Government is giving utmost importance on fish cultivation. He advised the officers to give importance on implementing the works after fixing a specific target. The Secretary of Fisheries Department Rameswar Das reported in the meeting that Tripura attains the highest position amongst the North-Eastern States in terms of demand of fish. He informed that at present 34 government and private hatcheries, 9 government farms and 28 laboratories are there in the State. He stated that in the financial year 2017-18 per head fish production of the state was 18.91 kg. In this context the CM said, the required target for fish production has to be fixed by keeping a similarity between the State people's demand of fish so that import of fish from outside states would not be required. The CM instructed the department for fixing the target by giving importance for fulfilling the demand of fish through State's own fish production. Beside that he instructed the officers of this department to make necessary arrangement for bringing fish from Dumbur Lake to Agartala. The Secretary of Fisheries also informed in the meeting that at present the area of water bodies in the

State is 34416.94 hectares. He further informed that in terms of fish fingerlings production the State is self-sufficient now. The Secretary of Fisheries has also discussed the action plan for the financial year 2018-19. He informed, meanwhile at various places of the State 47,000 prawn fingerlings, 80,000 *Pabda* fingerlings, 12,000 *Magur* fingerlings and 6,000 fingerlings of *Chital* fish have been distributed among the fish farmers. Apart from this, fingerlings have been distributed among 327 fish farmers considering 1,640 fingerlings to each. As of now a total of 5.37 Lakh fingerlings have been distributed among the fish farmers. He also informed that including Dumbur Lake fish fingerlings have been released in two rivers of the State. Moreover the department is providing assistance through supplying fish foods among the farmers. In this context referring the spending of funds for purchasing fish food from outside states the CM advised to take initiative and frame plan accordingly by the department keeping ahead a view for establishing fish food production centre in the State. Beside that he instructed to make plan on how the production of fish can be increased utilizing the natural water bodies and streams in the forest areas of the State, getting the benefit in the State through utilizing various ongoing central schemes on fish cultivation and utilizing scientific

methods of fish cultivation how the benefit can be gathered etc. He also instructed to oversee the proper distribution of fingerlings among the fish farmers.

In that review meeting among the others Minister for Fisheries Department Narendra Chandra Debbarma, Chief Secretary Sanjeev Ranjan, Principal Secretary of RD department L.K. Gupta, Secretary of Fisheries Department Rameswar Das and Director of Fisheries Department and other top officials were present.

Blood Donation camp organized by Kamalpur Press Club

Under the aegis of Kamalpur Press Club a blood donation camp was organized in the premises of the Press Club in connection with observance of Independence Day. The President of Kamalpur Press Club Ranbijoy Datta, Secretary Supriyo Datta along with other members of the Press Club were present in that camp. 23 persons donated blood in that camp.

Construction of 18,115 toilets in North District

Target has been set to construct toilets through MGNREGA among 18 thousand 115 poor families of 8 blocks under North District and the work is in progress. Till now, under this project toilets have been

constructed for 4 thousand 219 families. Rs. 12 thousand has been spent for construction of each of the toilet.

More than one lakh mandays generated in Bamutia Block

From the month of April to 7 August, 1 Lakh 976 mandays has been generated through MGNREGA in 20 gram panchayats under Bamutia Block. An amount of Rs. 1 crore 95 lakhs 71 thousand has been spent for various development works.

Nutrition and health awareness camp programme in Charilam block

As a part of nutrition and health awareness camps will be held in various places of Charilam block on 16 August. The health camps will be held in Netaji Colony Anganwadi centre under North Charilam Health Sub-centre, Karaimura Anganwadi centre no-2 under South Charilam Health Sub-centre, Chelikhala Anganwadi Centre no-8 under Chelikhala Health Sub-centre, Batanmura Anganwadi Centre under Bathanmura Health Sub-centre, Lalsinghmura Anganwadi Centre under Lalsinghmura Health Sub-centre, Chittarambari Anganwadi Centre under Sutarmura health Sub-centre, Shyamsundarpara Anganwadi Centre under Bongshibari Health sub-centre, Rangapania Anganwadi Centre no-4 under Ramchhara

Health Sub-centre. Awareness seminar will be held in the health camps alongwith mothers and children of the concerned areas. Moreover, medical service will be provided in the camps at free of cost.

GST: return filling desk opened

Chief Commissioner of State Tax under Taxes & Excise department of State Government has intimated all tax payers through a Notification that as per GST rule every registered general taxpayer has to submit FORM GSTR-1 and FORM GSTR 3B within March, 2019. Return filling desk has been opened in every office under Tax department for any kind of assistance to the taxpayers in submitting return. It is also intimated through the Notification that those businessmen availed Professional Identification Number (PID) as per previous rule upto 31 dec, 2017 but they did not produce FORM GST REG-26. They can produce details to State or Central Nodal Officer within 31 August, 2018 as per the annexure mentioned below.
