

Development of country depends on development of Agriculture :C.M

Agriculture is the back bone of Indian economy. First priority of government is development of agriculture and farmers welfare. Development of our country depends on development of agriculture. Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb said this in his inaugural speech at Gomati district level Kishan Mela and Exhibition-2020 organized by Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Department at District Institute of Education & Training (DIET), Kakraban on Feb 17. The state government is planning to make the farmers self-sufficient through cultivation of advance produce using science and technology. He said that Agriculture department, Fisheries department, Animal Resources Development department, Milk production can take a vital role in making economically developed state. 2 lakh 21 thousand farmers of the state are seeing profits since FCI started purchasing directly from them at MSP. 2000 hectare land has been certified in Tripura for organic farming. In future, more 3000 hectare land will be covered under organic farming. 3817 farmers of Kakraban received benefits of PM Kishan Samman Nidhi Yojana. Rs 6000

in three installments have been provided to the beneficiaries under the scheme. State Government is working for providing water supply connection to each family of the state within 2022. State Government has introduced Atal Jaldhara for this purpose. Agriculture Minister Pranajit Singha Roy delivered his speech as chief guest. Sabhadhipati of Gomati Zilla Parishad Swapan Adhikari, MLA Rampada Jamatia, MLA Biplab Ghosh, MLA Ratan Bhowmik, MLA Ranjit Das, MLA Burbamohan Tripura , MDC Joykishore Jamatia, DM of Gomati district Dr. T K Debnath, Director of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Department Debaprasad Sarkar were present in the programme. Addl.Chief Secretary SK Rakesh delivered welcome address. The programme was presided over by Chairman of the Agriculture related stranding committee of Gomati Zilla Parishad Padhma Mohan Jamatia . After the inaugural programme, CM alongwith the other dignitaries visited the exhibition stalls of different departments and awarded to the farmers of the district. They also distributed the soil testing cards. Cultural programme will be continued in the three days long kishan Mela.
