4387 farmers have been covered under Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana by the agriculture department in Sepahijala district till now. Among them 1046 farmers are from Bishalgarh block, 659 farmers from Charilam block, 383 farmers from Jampuijala block, 356 farmers from Mohanbhog block, 742 farmers from Nalchar block, 458 farmers from Boxanagar block and 743 farmers from Kathalia block.

In case of Aush paddy, if crop of farmers gets damaged due to any reason Rs

56,104 per hectare land will be provided to the affected farmers. In case of Aman paddy, if crop gets damaged due to any reason Rs 60,921 per hectare land will be provided to the affected farmers. There is target to provide agricultural loan through Kishan credit card to 9353 persons. Among them, 239 persons are sponsored. Till now loan of 46 farmers has been sanctioned. Rs 10 lakh 28 thousand 900 as loan has been provided. In this year Aman, Aush and Jhum have been cultivated in 18,886 hectare land of Sepahijala district.
