Tripura becomes champion in under-17 national school football

Tripura has earned another feature by snatching the title of champion of Under-17 Football Tournament in the 65th National School Games-2019-20. Yesterday in its final match the state team defeated Sikkim in 1-0 goal at Umakanta ministadium. The five-day National School Football was organized by the youth affairs and sports departments. As per schedule programme, Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana camp for the persons aged above 60 years will be held in premises of Mohanpur MC on February 4, Khayerpur Gitabitan hall on February 5, Belbari Gobinda Memorial Bhavan on February 6, Dukli Panchayat Samiti hall on February 7, Hezamara Community hall on February 10, Jirania Pancghayat Samiti hall on February 11, Mandwai Kharang Hall on February 13, Bhagat Singh Youth hostel on February 14, Bamutia block office on February 15, Sachindra Debbarma Memorial hall of Lefunga block on February 17. Persons benefiting under various social security schemes in North Tripura district

15,927 beneficiaries of North Tripura district have availed different pensions under different national social security schemes in North Tripura district. Under the scheme 890 persons aged above 80 years are getting Rs. 1000 per month and 1514 persons are getting Rs. 1000 pension per month under Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme. One hundred persons with 100 per cent blindness are getting Rs. 1500 per month under Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme. Similarly, 128 persons with less than 100 per cent blindness are getting Rs. 1000 per month. The office of the North district social welfare and social education department has informed this.
