

Schedule of National De-worming Programme

In connection with National De-worming Programme and preparation for that a press conference was held at the CMO office, Unakoti today. The CMO in-charge Dr. Shankhasbhubhra Debnath and nodal officer of the health department Ayan Roy were present in the press meet. It was informed in the press conference that at 11 am., February 7, the National De-worming Programme would be launched at Netaji Vidyapith. In Unakoti district target has been set to feed de-worming medicine to 1,00,122 children. Out of this target 32,737 children will be fed de-worming medicine in Anganwadi centres and 67385 children will be fed in schools. There will be 1,046 centres in total in Unakoti district for administering de-worming medicine.

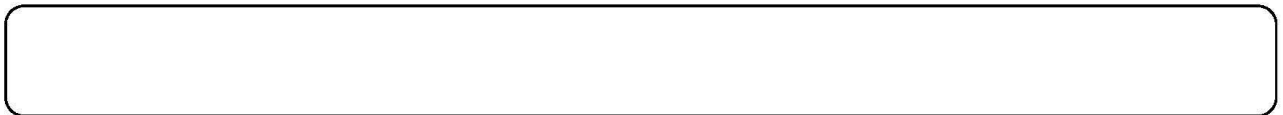
De-worming programme in West Tripura district

Alongwith rest of the state as a part of the National De-worming Programme 2,60,488 children will be fed de-worming medicine in West Tripura district on February 8 under the initiative of the health and family welfare department. Necessary preparations for that have been taken in blocks and schools.

Giving details about the programme the CMO said, de-worming medicine will be given to 53,371 enlisted children, 2,924 unlisted children and 27,577 school drop-outs through 1773 Anganwadi Centres. In addition, the programme would cover 1,33,086 students of 634 government schools and 43,530 students of private schools .

Prior permission necessary for assembling in public place

There is legal provision for regulation of public assemblies, processions and use of music and other sound system in public places under section 78-81 of Tripura Police Act, 2007. It has been noticed that organizers of any assembly take permission from different departments for use of ground under their control in the state before seeking permission for holding assemblies from the police.

Now, it has been decided that all departments who hold/ own public places may not give their premises to any organizer for holding assembly unless the organizers have obtained prior clearance from the police, so that proper (police) arrangements are made in time to avoid any law and order problem.
