

Administrative and health camp held in two places of Chandipur block

An administrative and health camp was organized by Kailashahar sub-divisional administration in Bhadrupalli high school on 7th June and Rangrung High School of Chandipur block on June 11. Eight AADHAAR cards , 82 PRTC, 4 S.C certificates have been provided to the applicants in the camp held at Bhadrupalli High School. Besides this, medicine has been provided to 46 patients free of cost; 40 AADHAAR cards, 20 PRTC and 45 S.C certificates have been provided to the applicants in the camp held at Rangrung High School. Moreover, medicine has been provided to 35 patients free of cost in the camp. Addl. SDM of Kailashahar subdivision Arindam Das was present in both the camps. He interacted with the local people who gathered in these camps regarding various problems and their possible solutions.

Cent percent candidates passed in Madhyamik examination in 5 schools of Hrishyamukh block

Percentage of passing in the Madhyamik examination, 2019 conducted by TBSE is 82.09. In this year, total 508 candidates of

23 schools of the block had been appeared in Madhyamik examination, 2019. 417 candidates out of them have passed. 206 candidates out of 241 male candidates and 211 candidates out of 267 female candidates have passed. Cent percent candidates of 5 schools of the block appeared in Madhyamik examination, 2019 have passed. These are –Devipur High School, East Rajnagar High School, East Sarashima High School, Gajaria High School and Ishan Chandra High School. The office of the inspectorate of schools, Belonia, informed this.

Sewing machines provided to 24 beneficiaries of Bakafa block

Various instruments were distributed by Bakafa Panchayat Samiti among 96 beneficiaries of 8 panchayats of Bakafa block on June 13. Under the scheme, sewing machines have been provided to 24 beneficiaries of the block. With each sewing machine costing Rs 5900, a total of Rs one lakh forty one thousand six hundred has been spent for this purpose. 24 set musical instruments have been distributed. Each musical instrument worth Rs 11,560, totalling Rs 2 lakh 77 thousand 440 has been spent on this. Instruments hve been provided to 24 beneficiaries for carpentry. An amount of Rs 5200 has been spent for
