



consistence with that the pilot project in Tripura is being launched. As per Socio-Economic and Caste Census (SECC) beneficiaries of this scheme will be selected. Those who have RSBY card and registered in 2016 or later will also be covered under the scheme. Difficult diseases like neuro-problems, cardiac surgery etc. will be covered and primarily this scheme is being introduced in AGMC and GB Hospital and later on it will be extended to 62 other health centres of the state. Tripura Health Protection Society, under the National Health Mission will be in charge of implementation of the scheme.

On this occasion the Chief Minister and Health Minister handed over e-Health cards to eight beneficiaries. The programme was also attended by the chief secretary Sanjib Ranjan, principal secretary to the Chief Minister Kumar Alok and other top officials.
