

Shyama Sangeet competition on Diwali

In this competition students from various schools will participate. Participants securing first, second and third ranks will be awarded. This decision has been taken in the meeting of Cultural Advisory Committee held yesterday.

ST/SC Students felicitated with scholarships in Khowai

Tribal students and SC students were felicitated with merit scholarship and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Merit Scholarship respectively today at a function organized at Khowai town hall. This sub-division level programme was inaugurated by the Tribal Welfare Minister Mewar Kumar Jamatia. Addressing the gathering the minister said, the government had accorded top priority to upgradation of the education system of the state. So, he urged all comprising teachers and

guardians to take advantage of this opportunity to give quality education to the children.

The programme was also attended by MLA Prasanta Debbarma, BAC chairman of Tulashikhar block Pradip Debbarma, DM Rabindra Reang and SDM Sonakshi Singh Tomar. The Tribal Welfare Minister and MLA handed over certificates and scholarship to the recipients of the scholarship. In this programme 800 tribal students who secured 60 per cent marks received merit scholarship and 96 SC students who secured similar distinction received Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Merit Scholarship. The recipients of the awards were selected from 77 schools of the subdivision.

Hospital. After eye check-up of 80 patients of this subdivision necessary medicines were provided free of cost in that camp. Moreover cataract surgery of 10 patients was also executed in that camp. This has been informed by Bishalgarh Sub-Divisional Hospital.

Cooperative Week observance: Essay competition to be held

Construction of Dining Hall in various schools of Sepahijala

Construction of Mid-Day-Meal dining hall under MGNREGA in this current financial year for 9 schools under Sepahijala district is in progress. Construction of 60-seated dining hall at Kalamchoura H.S. School, 100-seated dining hall at Laxman Dhepa High School, 60-seated dining hall at Takarjala South H.S. School and 100-seated dining hall at Gokulnagar English Medium School under this project is in progress.

An amount of Rs.79 lakh 20 thousand is being spent for construction of dining halls in these four schools. Apart from that an amount of Rs. 1 crore 4 lakh 20 thousand will be spent for construction of a dining hall with sitting capacity of 60 at Nalchar High school, dining hall with sitting capacity of 100 at Taibandal H.S school, dining hall with sitting capacity of 100 at Charilam H.S School, dining hall with sitting capacity of 60 at Bashpukur High School and dining hall

with sitting capacity of 100 at South Nalchar High School.

Assistance for fish cultivation in Sepahijala district

Fisheries department has taken various initiatives for expansion of fish cultivation in Sepahijala district during the current year. Among these initiatives, 84 persons of the district have been provided assistance under mixed fish cultivation scheme. An amount of Rs 9 lakh 91 thousand 680 has been spent for this purpose. 153 persons have been provided assistance under season-based fish cultivation scheme. An amount of Rs 23 lakh 37 thousand 840 has been spent for this purpose. 243 beneficiaries have been provided various articles for cultivation of fish in small pond. An amount of Rs 2 lakh 46 thousand 888 has been spent under the scheme. 28 persons have been assisted with artificial feed under fish cultivation scheme. An amount of Rs 14 lakh 54 thousand 880 has been spent for this purpose. 170 persons have been assisted for prawn cultivation at the price of Rs 59 thousand.

Development activities with PDF in Charilam

Various development programmes have been implemented with panchayat

development fund in 11 gram panchayats and 10 village committee areas of Charilam block on the occasion of Durga Puja festival generating a total of 10,152 mandays. In the process 5076 persons have got employment. An amount of Rs 17 lakh 96 thousand 900 has been spent for this purpose.

Restriction on movement of people in Indo-Bangladesh border of West Tripura District

As per the provisions of section 144 of Cr.P.C ,1973, D.M, West Tripura District, has prohibited movement of people and any vehicle along 500 metre distance of Indo-Bangladesh international border under Sadar and Mohanpur Sub-divisions of West Tripura district between 8.00P.M To 5.00 A.M. However, this prohibitions order shall not be applicable to movement of Military/Para-military Force and State Police Personnel and their vehicles engaged in maintenance of law and order, movement of the members of public authorized by the D.M (West), S.P (West) and SDMs of Sadar and Mohanpur Sub-divisions, movement of government servants when it is essential for discharge of emergent official duties and movement of patients requiring immediate medical attention. The above restriction came into force with effect from 4th October, 2018

and shall remain in force up to 3rd January, 2019. Any person violating this order shall be liable to be prosecuted under section 188 I.P.C.

Wildlife Week to be observed in Sepahijala Sanctuary on Nov 2

The 64th state level Wildlife Week will be observed in Sepahijala sanctuary on November 2. Recently a preparatory meeting was held at the conference hall of Sepahijala sanctuary to make the state level programme a success.
