

## **Floricultural activities in Udaipur**

Cultivation of various flowers is going on under MIDH scheme in Matabari and Tepania block of Udaipur subdivision during the current financial year. Under this scheme cultivation of Rajnigandha in 0.8 hectare, Gladiolus in 1.85 hectare and Marigold in 2.5 hectare land under this block is in progress. Similarly, cultivation of Rajnigandha in 0.8 hectare, Gladiolus in 1.6 hectare and Marigold in 2.25 hectare land under Tepania block is in progress. For this purpose an amount of Rs.75 thousand will be spent per hectare for cultivation of Rajnigandha and Gladiolus and an amount of Rs. 20 thousand will be spent per hectare for cultivation of Marigold.

## **Eye treatment camp at Khowai**

Under the aegis of West Tripura District Blindness Control Society an eye treatment camp was organized at Khowai District hospital on December 29. Doctors treated and provided free of cost medicines to 50 eye patients of that locality in that camp. Moreover, after diagnosis of 11 eye patients having cataract were sent to Agartala for undergoing cataract surgery free of cost.

## **Assistance for increase of fish production in Kanchanpur**

Various assistances are being provided by Kanchanpur superintendent of fisheries office to the fish cultivators of remote areas in Kanchanpur subdivision during the current financial year to enhance fish production. With a view to increasing yield of fish fingerlings, supply of 800 C C fish fingerlings to each of 10 fish cultivators of this subdivision is in progress. Apart from that, fish feed, lime etc. will be provided. An amount of Rs. 80 thousand 200 will be spent for this purpose.

## **Tripura gets its first Tool Room & Training Centre**

There was a time when the youths used to get theoretical knowledge of various trades in it is of the state, with no facilities for practical training. Now after completing their training from ITI students could get practical training; for this purpose the newly inaugurated Tool Room and Training Centre has been opened, stated the Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb after dedicating the centre at R.K.
