

State Planning Board meeting: CM stressed on creation of permanent income through development of tourism

A meeting of state planning board was held at conference hall no-2 of Civil Secretariat under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb on 3 June. In that meeting, more importance was given on work of various departments like agriculture, health, education, tourism, home, fishery, power, animal resources development, urban development and rural development. Reviewing various reports on development, the Chief Minister expressed that the plan taken for enhance the development of the state within three years must be completed within schedule time. Every year, state is paying to import fish, eggs, milk, agricultural seed etc. from other states. Now, a special plan has to be taken for working to stop this expenditure. Chief Minister said that tourism is an important sector in development of the state. He stressed on development of Matabari, Chabimura, Dumbur lake and other tourist spots to attract the tourists. He instructed to open exhibition stall of Handloom & Handicrafts industry of Tripura beside 9 Km stretch of Assam – Agartala National Highway as earmarked by PWD. He also advised to arrange shop of food beside the road for convenience of the tourists. He said that importance has to be given on creation of permanent income through inclusive development of tourism. Keeping coordination between one another various departments of the state government should review their activities after regular intervals for proper implementation of the planning as taken by the State Planning Board for the next three years.

Vice-chairman of state planning board cum Advisor of state government R. K. Mathur through a power-point presentation highlighted the plan of various departments for next three years. While discussing the action plan of Agriculture & Farmer's welfare department Shri Mathur stated that this department should take responsibility to enhance the income of famers in next three years through increase production by high yield & hybrid seeds,

cultivation in SRI system. He stated that special emphasis has been given on production of meat, eggs and milk in the state. ARD Department should take responsibility for this purpose. Beside that importance has been given to strengthen the dairy co-operative societies of the state. Discussion was also held to fulfill the demand of fish in the state through increasing fish production by the Fisheries department within next three years. Several steps have been taken by Education department to improve the quality education in the state. To outreach the health facilities among the people of the state, planning has been taken for development of health infrastructure. Moreover, Vice-chairman of the State Planning Board R K Mathur discussed on various activities and plan of Power, Forest, PWD, Panchayat, Urban Development etc. departments. Apart from Chief Minister, Deputy Chief Minister Jishnu Debbarman, Fishery Minister Narendra Chandra Debbarma, Tourism Minister Pranajit Singha Roy, Forest Minister Mevar Kumar Jamatia, MLA Kalyani Roy, acting chief secretary Manoj Kumar and other top officials of various departments and other members of the planning board took part in the meeting.

Cabinet approves amendment of Tripura Industrial Investment Promotion Incentive Scheme

With the objective taken up earlier to enhance developments of ten backward blocks, two more blocks Ganganagar and Ampii have been approved in yesterday's Cabinet meeting. Decisions have been taken in the Cabinet meeting to augment developments in every sphere among all the twelve blocks. The Education Minister Ratan Lal Nath informed this in a press briefing at Civil Secretariat held yesterday evening. He informed that a sum of Rs.50 crores would remain sanctioned from the State's budget for the next three years to transform these twelve blocks as Model blocks. This amount will be spent for the development works of these twelve blocks. The Education Minister also added that some indicators of development have been identified so that these blocks may attain overall development like other blocks. He said, among these development sectors 20 percent would be spent for health & nutrition, 20 percent for infrastructure, 15 percent for employment generation & skill development, 5 percent would be spent for financial inclusion. On this aspect, an empower committee headed by the Chief Secretary would be formed. This empower committee will direct the district administrations to

sanction additional fund for the development works of State and Central projects at the concerned backward blocks. The Chief Minister would review the works of this empower committee after every six months. Moreover, an officer in the rank of Special Secretary will be in-charge of each block. He will monitor the various development works of the concerned block. The Education Minister Shri Nath asserted that the employees working under these backward blocks will be assigned with responsibilities for three years. After completion of three years they would get posting at their preferred places. Apart from that, 80 percent of the posts those are lying vacant in these backward blocks will be filled up, he also added. The identified backward blocks are Chawmanu, Dumburnagar, Raishyabari, Damchera, Dasda, Karbook, Silachari, Mungiakami, Rupaichari, Tulashikhar, Ganganagar and Ampii.

The Education Minister also informed that the prime priority of the State Government is employment generation. With this objective to bring large scale industries along with small, medium industries, the State cabinet has approved the amendment of Tripura Industrial Investment Promotion Incentive Scheme. The Education Minister said that earlier there was no provision of subsidy for investment in large scale industry in the state. Subsidy was given only to the small and medium scale industries. He said that seven sectors are given top most priority which include bamboo industry, rubber, agriculture, horticulture, tea processing, gas industry with these hotel & tourism and hospital & nursing included now.

He also said that the State government will provide subsidy on capital investment, industrial promotion subsidy on SGST, subsidy on bank loan, electricity, transportation cost, export promotion cost. He expressed hope that investors will be interested to set up big industries in this state due to providing subsidies to them.
