

Assistance provided for animal husbandry under PDF in Bishalgarh block

Various schemes are being implemented by the animal resources development department to make rural people self-dependent through animal husbandry in Bishalgarh block. The office of the assistant director of animal resources development department, Bishalgarh informed that Rs 7000 has been provided to each of 66 families of the block under panchayat development fund for goat farming. Rs 4 lakh 62 thousand in total has been spent for this purpose.

Moreover, Rs 2700 has been provided to each of 40 families of the block under panchayat development fund for pig farming. Rs 1 lakh 80 thousand in total has been spent for this purpose. On the other hand, Rs 3 lakh 88 thousand has been provided to 40 families of the block under Rashtriya Krishi Vikash Yojana for pig farming. An amount of Rs 9700 has been provided to each family and Rs 5000 has been provided to each of 30 families for goat farming. Rs 1 lakh 50 thousand has been spent for this purpose.

Deep tube wells installed in Salema block

Deep tube wells have been installed by DWS Department in seven places of Salema block of Kamalpur subdivision. The deep tube wells have been installed in Ramnath Chowdhury para of Katalutma panchayat, Nakfool Biswarani para of Ashapura Rowaja para, Jogendra Debbbarma para of Nakfool panchayat, Chhinisingh para of Mechurai village, Sharat Chowdhury para of Maharaniपुर, North Debbbari of Debbbari panchayat and Bagantila of Mechhiria. Rs 1 core 35 lakh 65 thousand in total had been spent for installation of the new deep tube wells. The office of the executive engineer of Kamalpur subdivision, DWS has informed that construction work of pump house and installation work of pipe line for deep tube wells have been accomplished.

Bharat Scout and Guides Flag day-2019
